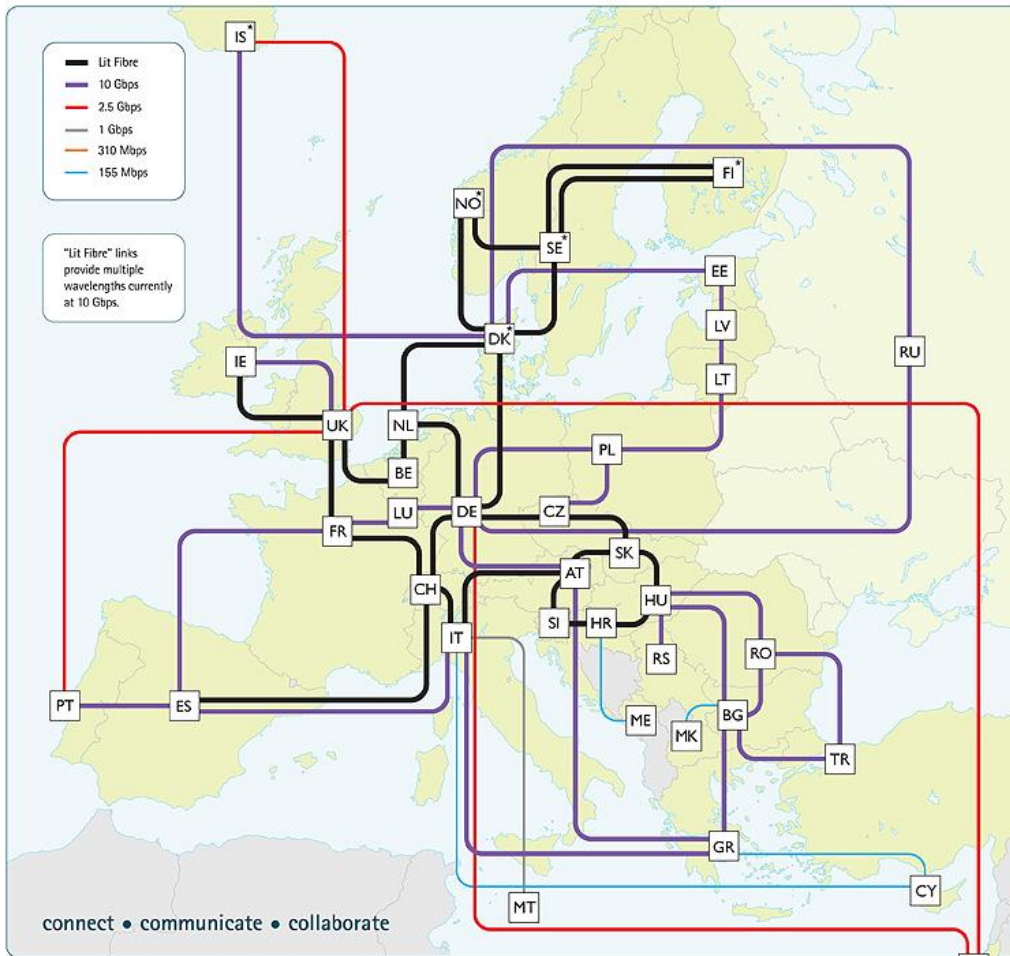

- Standardisation and take-up

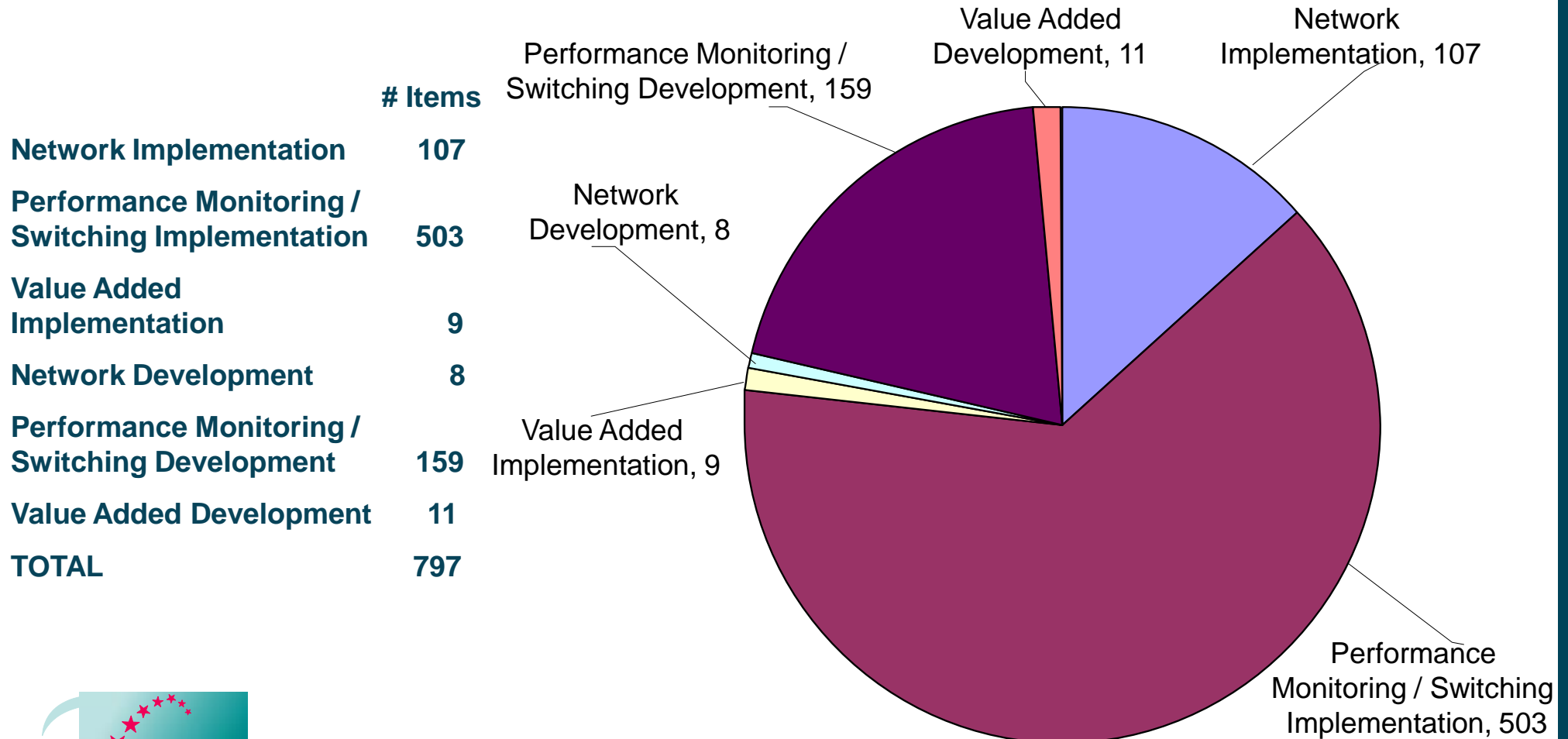


- Audit existing IP

- The IPR Audit identified nearly 800 software licences in use within the GÉANT project.
- At least 12 different licence types have been imported including:
 - Apache Licence versions 1.1 and 2.0
 - BEA Systems, Inc. Binary Code Licence
 - BSD style licence
 - Common Development And Distribution v1.0 and GPL v2
 - Common Public Licence 1.0 (CPL)
 - Eclipse Public Licence v1.0
 - GPL, GPL v2 and Lesser General Public Licence (LGPL) versions 2.1 and 3
 - Mozilla Public Licence
 - Sun Freeware Licence
