2 - Education

> Sponsor classes students 15-18 years

WHO: Students15-18 years-old Schools near the experiments.

WHAT: each experiment provides an ambassador to at least one class in a local school HOW: education programme with 4 or 5 visits (in the schools and at CERN). Work done by students (electricity, cosmic rays detectors, analysis of events, other ideas?).
