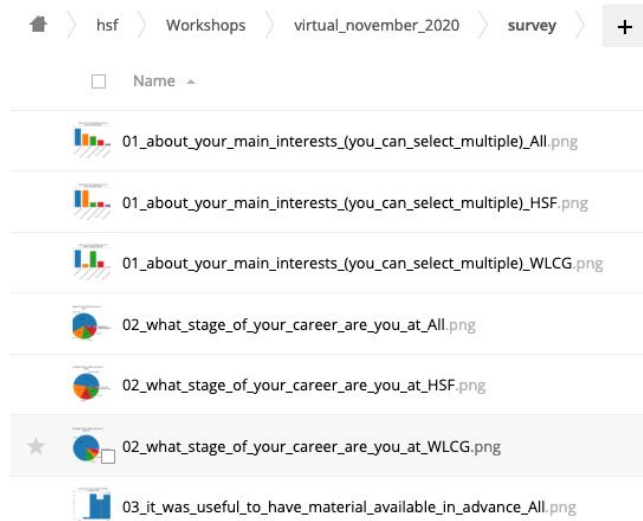
A long time ago in a Zoom meeting far, far away...

- Generally attendance was about 100 in each session

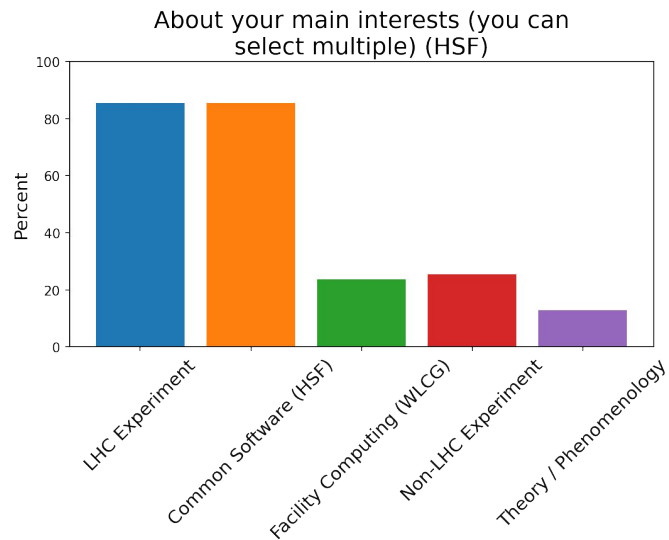


The Survey

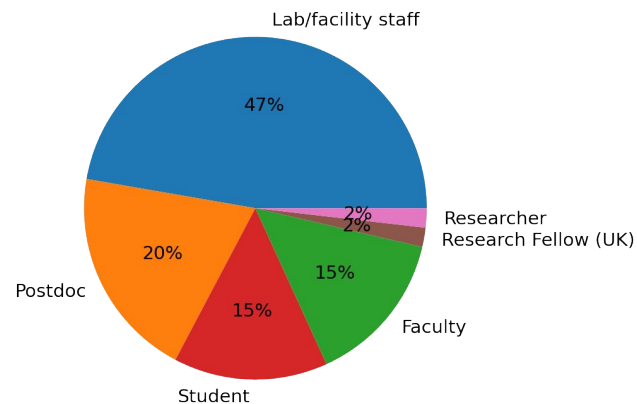
- Had more or less the same kind of survey as we had had in May

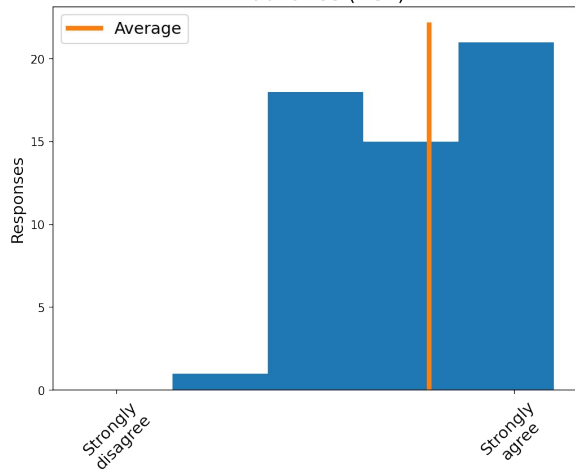
What stage of your career are you at (HSF)



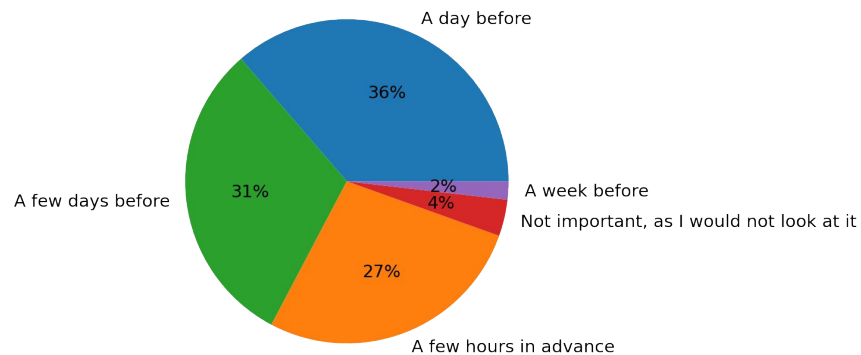
- More mixed participant background than May

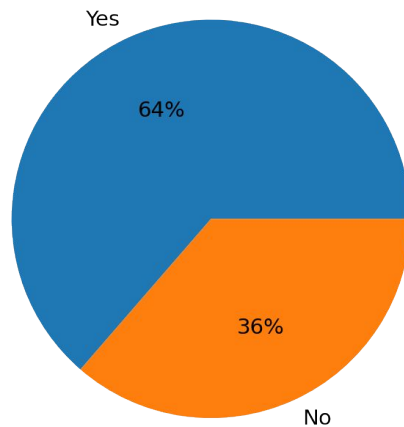
It was useful to have material available in advance (HSF)



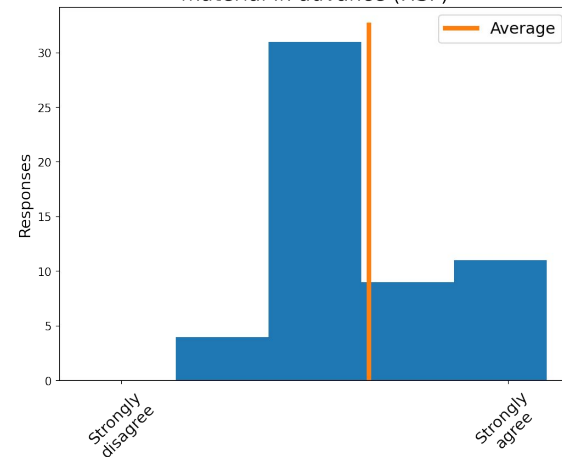

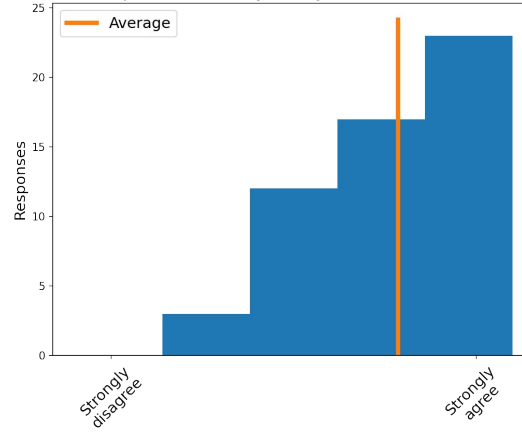

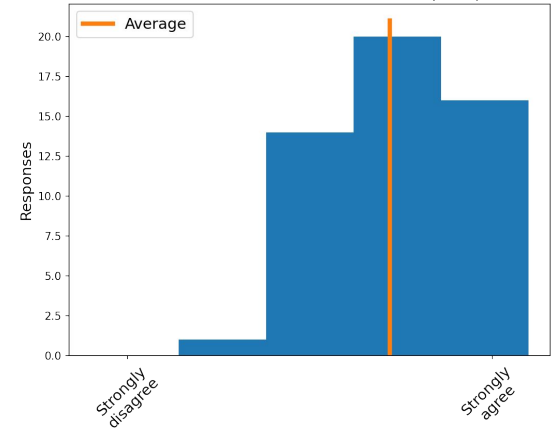
In the workshop the amount of discussion time varied from 25-50%. In your opinion the ideal amount of discussion time would be (HSF)



Sticking strictly to the scheduled timetable is important (even cutting off speakers if they badly overrun) (HSF)



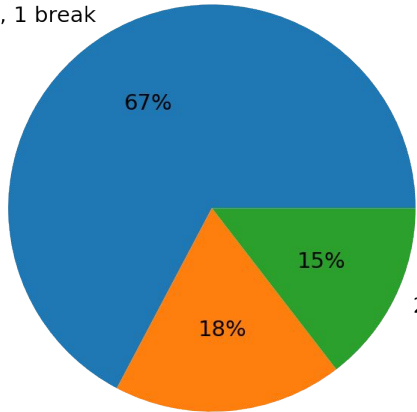
Having questions / discussion in the live notes after the time for the "live" discussion ran out was useful (HSF)

3 hours, 1 break



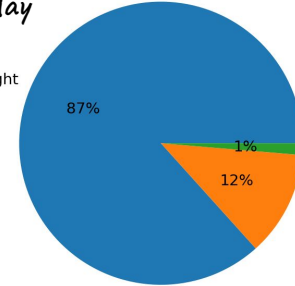
4 hours, 2 breaks

Too long, even 2 hours is difficult to concentrate for

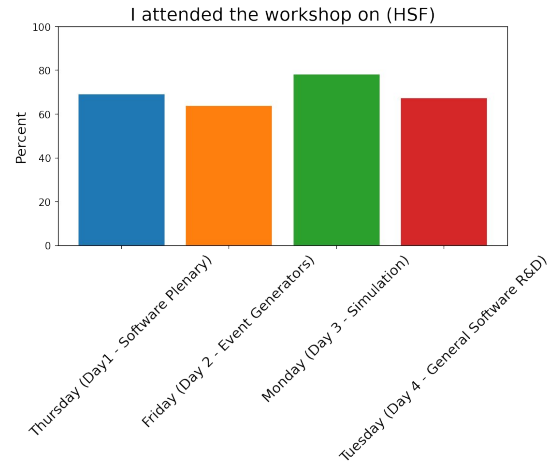
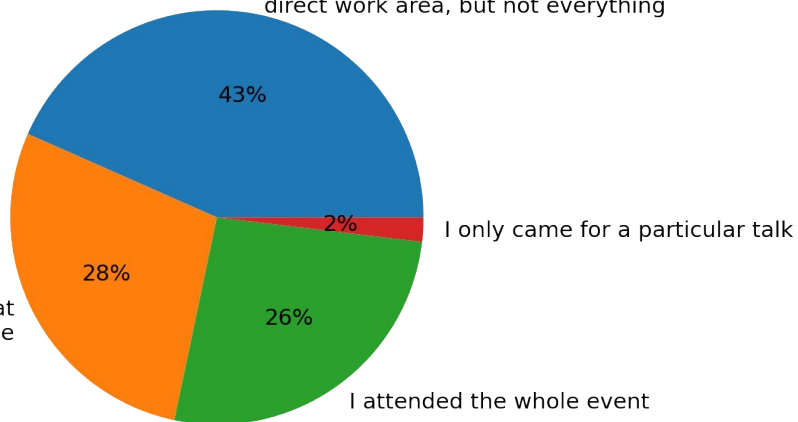
Too short, sessions should be longer (with breaks)

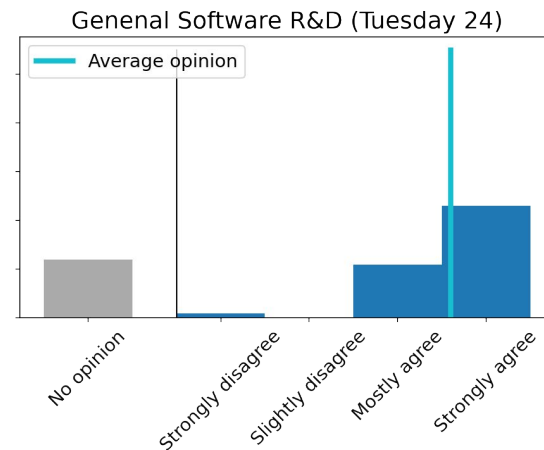
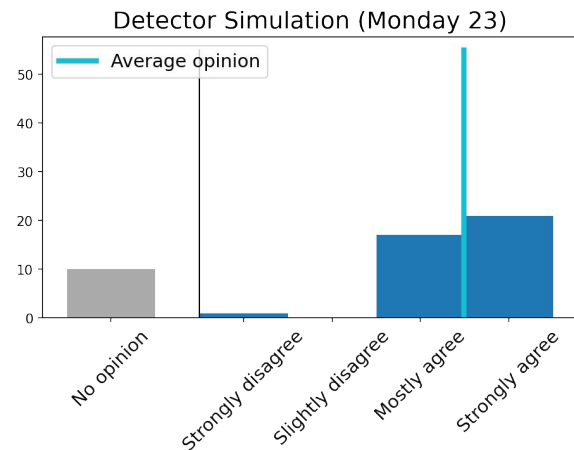
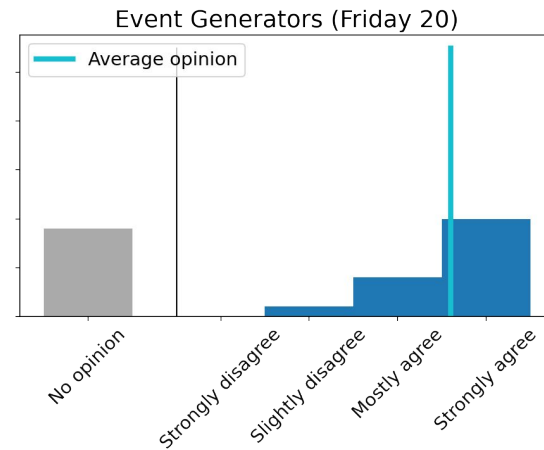
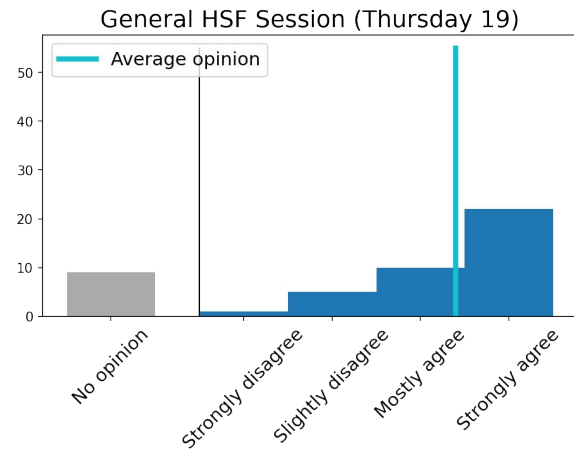
For the workshop (HSF)

I attended some sessions outside my direct work area, but not everything



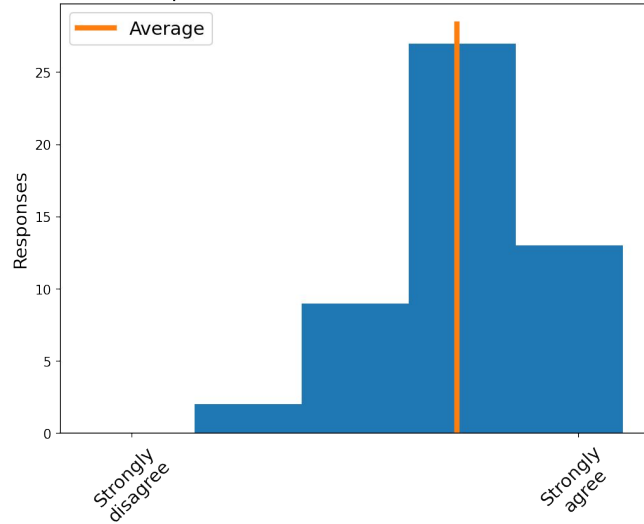
The sessions that were organised were very useful...

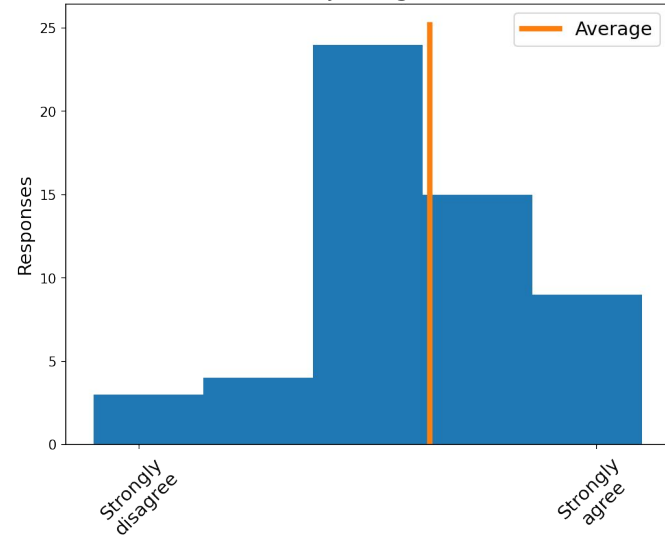


For next events...

For this event we organised a call for abstracts to cover software R&D more generally (Tuesday session). Should we repeat this call in the future? (HSF)

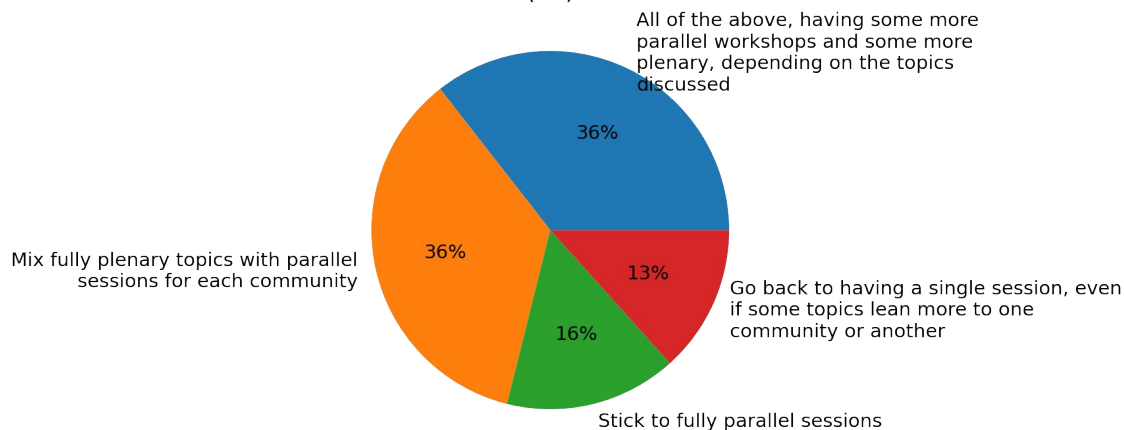


If we organised dedicated discussion sessions to carry on the workshop discussions later, separate from HSF Working Group meetings, would you be interested in joining them? (HSF)

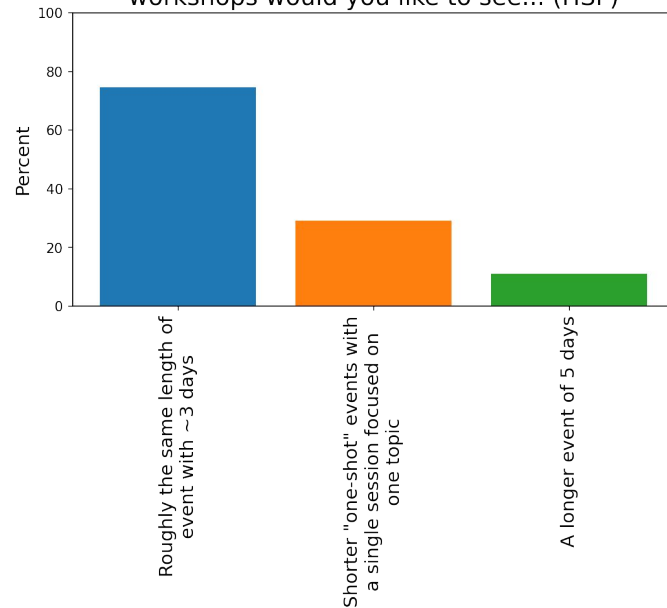


For Next Events...
