

### Baltic school - the overall idea



 Plan to establish an annual regional training school in high-energy physics and accelerator technologies;

 To be hosted, on a rotational basis, in one of the three Baltic countries by one of the CBG institutes;

 Prioritise students and young researchers from the Baltic countries, especially the CBG institutes, but keep the school open to the wider European audience, and beyond;

The first school to be held in Latvia and organised by the Riga Technical University;



# Baltic school - 2020 proposal



Planned to hold the inaugural edition in the summer of 2020;

 Submitted a COST Action proposal for funding for a training school to "CA16201 - PARTICLEFACE" in January 2020;

Successful application was awarded a total of €16′300.00 in February 2020;

2020 edition initially postponed, later cancelled due to covid19;

• CA16201 confirmed that the **funding** will be **available in 2021**! (until end of Sept.);

Decided in the CBG CT meeting, to run the 2020 school as planned in 2021!





• Time: 02.-06. of August 2021 (5 days, 4 nights);

Location: Camping "Ronīši", Klapkalnciems, approx. 50 km west of Riga;

Target: 30 participants (max. of ~40);

• CBG: each member should enrol at least 2 participants from their institute

(more spaces can be allocated, provided that all members agree);

Lecturers: Prof., Dr. Yuri Dokshitzer (QFT, QED, QCD);

Prof., Dr. Jonathan Ellis (SM and beyond SM);

Prof., Dr. Matteo Cacciari (phenomenology, collider physics);

Dr. Maurizio Vretenar (accelerator technologies);

- Fees: COST Action does not permit registration fees levied on the participants;
- Participants will be able to reclaim travel and accommodation costs;
- The accommodation will be centrally booked, at a cost of €50.00 per person per night;
- Average expected reimbursement per participant is €250.00;
- Total expected reimbursement for participants is €7500.00;
- COST budget for lecturers and local organisation expenses is €8800.00;
- Above numbers given for 30 participants;





- Content:
  - 12 lecture blocks of 1.5-2 hours (3 blocks per lecturer);
  - 4 'discussion sessions' 1.5-2 hours organized after each 3 lecture blocks;
  - 1 conference dinner, planned for Wednesday evening;
  - 1 keynote speaker (TBD);
- Other, flexible arrangements should be made for the week, such as the organisation of a 'Welcome event' on the Monday evening, arranging for some leisure activities in the evenings, etc.
