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






A journey: The History of RRENs in Africa

AfricaConnect3 builds on the achievements of seve:

- The <u>EUMEDCONNECT</u> project, which has provided a research and education network for Northern Africa and the Middle East since 2004 with our regional partner ASREN.
- And the <u>AfricaConnect</u> project which helped establish a regional gateway for collaborative research and education (R&E) in Southern and Eastern Africa between 2011 and 2014 with our regional partners the UbuntuNet Alliance.
- AfricaConnect2 saw the collaboration between the three major RRENs within the African continent: the UbuntuNet Alliance, the West and Central African Research and Education Network (WACREN) and the Arab States Research and Education Network (ASREN).













What are National Research and Education Networks?



Mostly publicly funded

Provide dedicated, uncongested Internet connectivity and value-added services for knowledge institutions in their country, such as: universities, research centres, and libraries

Typically connected to a regional counterpart (RRENs)

African RRENs are linked to global research and education networks across the globe via its interconnection with GÉANT

These linkages facilitate collaborative research and innovative learning worldwide

There are over 100 NRENs worldwide with 38 in Africa








A Pan-African Network in the making

- 21 African NRENs are connected to a regional network:
 - UbuntuNet Alliance: Burundi, Kenya, Malawi,
 Mozambique, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania,
 Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe
 - WACREN: Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Nigeria, Togo, Burkina-Faso and Benin
 - ASREN: Algeria, Egypt, Morocco and Tunisia
 - All three regional networks are still under construction.
 - More than 1600 African institutions can collaborate with peers across the world:
 - helping to connect remote users
 - retain local talents and fight brain drain
