Membership fee situation 2021

- Outstanding collaboration fees for 2019 and 2020 at time of previous meeting
 - ✓ Sweden 60 kCHF paid for 2020 (Jan/21)
 - ✓ Spain 116 kCHF paid for 2019 and 2020 (Feb/21)
 - Poland 20.5 for 2019, 57.4 kCHF for 2020 not yet paid
 - → Poland also problematic for 2021
- Collaboration fees for 2021 already paid
 - Norway 60 Jan/21Germany 60 Feb/21
 - > CERN 95 May/21
 - Bulgaria 15 (part 1) May/21 mew member, signed April 2021
 - ➤ Slovakia 60 Jun/21 full fee since this year!
 - Finland 60 Jun/21
- Institute memberships for 2021
 - Czech TU Prague 10 kCHF
 May/21 institute member since 2019
- Payments without a signed agreement
 - Portugal not yet



Spokesperson of experiments at CERN (and ISOLDE)

- The new INTC chairman informs the committee that ISOLDE now has a backlog of 1475 shifts

 K. Riisager tells the committee that there have been proposals submitted to the INTC where there is no spokesperson from an institute from a member state of the ISOLDE collaboration. This is of concern because the experiment would not be covered by the ISOLDE MoU with CERN, and the collaboration contributes financially towards the running of the ISOLDE facility. A discussion follows about how to address this issue and the committee decides that, for the time being, at least one spokesperson on a proposal must be from an institute in a country that is a member of the ISOLDE collaboration
- INTC meeting Feb. 2021: a proposal is submitted without a spokesperson from an ISOLDE member institution/country.

Pippa Wells, deputy Dir. Of Research and Computing comments: make sure that it is visible to your users that this is a condition to propose an experiment. How can they know it?

New information on ISOLDE web page (since March 2021):

Spokespersons of a proposal for ISOLDE

At its meeting of February 2017, the ISCC decided that proposals should have at least one spokesperson from an ISOLDE Collaboration member institution, in a country that has signed the ISOLDE MoU with CERN. You can find the list of institutes from member states of the ISOLDE collaboration in Annex 4 of the ISOLDE MoU here. Certain institutes, that are not from an ISOLDE member state, have signed a special collaboration agreement with the collaboration which allows their employees to act as sole experiment spokespersons. A list of these institutes can be found here.

Persons from non-member countries/institutes are welcome to apply for beamtime, provided their request is supported by a co-spokesperson from a member country/institute.

INTC meeting June 2021: another proposal is submitted without a spokesperson from an ISOLDE member institution/country well before deadline – GN informs the authors to contact somebody from the collaboration, referring to the website for information. No action taken by proposers.



Tehran new Institute Member?



- Current situation:
 - > one expert in solid state physics based in ISOLDE Physics Group
 - Collaboration ongoing with CMS (School of Particles and Accelerators)
- Future possible collaborations with ISOLDE:
 - > Extend collaboration with other schools (e.g. Physics, Nanoscience, ...)?
 - > PhD students and staff sent for long-term stay at ISOLDE
 - > to be trained and join developments and operation
 - > expertise relevant for physics groups, but also potentially target team, laser team, accelerator team, ...
