#### **Venue and how to get there:**

The RICH2022 conference will be held at the John McIntyre Conference Centre (JMCC) of the University of Edinburgh, located in Pollock Halls campus.

**Queen Elizabeth's death:**

Please note that in Edinburgh a huge number of people will be expected next week due to the Queen's death. Her body is expected to be transported by road from her residence in Balmoral to the Palace of Holyrood house at the bottom of the Royal mile in Edinburgh on Sunday 11 September. A procession will follow on Monday 12 September along the Royal Mile followed by a Vigil of the Princes attended by members of the Royal Family. The former monarch's coffin is expected to lie in state for 24 hours at the cathedral where members of the public will be able to file past to pay their respects. The City of Edinburgh Council have warned of road closures across the capital as they prepare for the movement of the longest-reigning monarch in British history.
