- Established in 2012 by Michael Hoch within the CMS Collaboration at CERN
- Education and outreach initiative aiming to engage general public in the excitement of scientific research in HEP, i.e. creating dialogues between scientists, artists and educators to enhance appreciation and awareness of HEP and its benefits to society
- Long list of international projects in collaboration with universities, schools, museums, individuals ...



ORIGIN

- Established in 2018
- Joined effort supported by many collaborations/partners from HEP, astrophysics, gravitational waves, neutrino physics, muography ... communities
- Cross-disciplinary science engagement & networking with emphasis on education
- “Think globally, act locally” principle



CMS Collaboration Board Committee

- New committee launched within CMS on Sept. 1, 2021
- Answers to the CMS Collaboration Board (i.e. board of institute representatives)
- Part of the CMS Communications group
- Members have a 2-year mandate; attempt to cover all regions ...

- Advertise and create awareness about Origin projects within CMS and elsewhere
- Establish experience & tradition in handling SciArtEd projects
- Document each project and maintain archive of material

ORIGIN-CMS Committee Mandate

- To review proposals for high-profile SciArtEd projects and recommend which projects should be accepted by CMS
- To devise a 12-month rolling plan of ORIGIN-CMS SciArtEd projects that CMS, via its Collaboration Board, formally endorses and to periodically report to the Collaboration Board on the execution of the plan
- To establish a memorandum of understanding for each accepted project between CMS and the concerned party, documenting the scope of the project and how each partner, including CMS, will participate
- To advise, follow up and assist approved ongoing projects in the manner described in the corresponding memorandum of understanding (each project is followed up by one committee member acting as liaison between CMS and project partners)
- To seek support and additional funding for SciArtEd projects
- To help maintaining the CMS SciArtEd material collection at CERN
