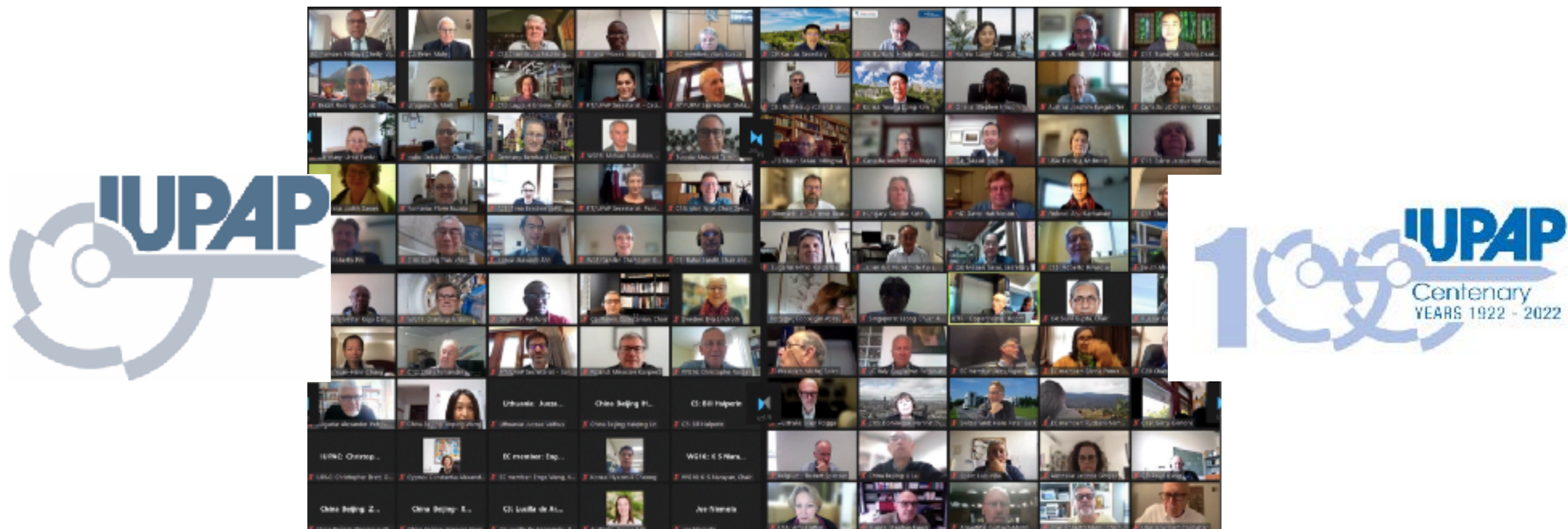


100 IUPAP Photo Contest

On the occasion of the centennial celebrations we will have a Photo Contest to celebrate the beauty of physics, its impact on our everyday lives and the ways in which physics research and education is carried out all over the world.



Main Features:

Two categories

- **Beyond our eyes** (for images obtained through special scientific equipment or made via computer simulations of physical processes)
- **At a glance** (for all other images obtained with any type of camera)

Judging will be conducted by a panel of judges selected by IUPAP which may include IUPAP Staff. Joe Niemela is advancing with this selection.

The jury will select 6 entries in each category; 3 in each category will receive a monetary award (1st: 2000euro; 2nd: 1000euro; 3rd: 500euro) and the other 3 honorary awards.

2 more photos in each category will be selected over IUPAP's social networks by its followers and will be given "People's Choice" recognition.

The 12 finalists selected by the Jury and those voted "popularly" will be made available for printing and as screensavers. They will also be exhibited in Trieste and used on IUPAP posters, other material related to the Centenary and online.

Additional images might be selected by the various IUPAP's structures to be used on the IUPAP website (we are still discussing about it).

Now, some aspects to take into consideration:

- the images submitted to the “Beyond our eyes” category should be judged for scientific content that can be subfield specific
- we have to pre-filter the entries before asking the jury to analyze them

How to address these two issues?

At the time of submission the entrant will have to choose the Commission, Affiliated Commission or Working Group that is more closely related to the theme of the image. The option “Other” will also be available.

Most images presented in the “Beyond our eyes” category will likely have a “scientific content” and will choose a Comm, AC or WG. Thus, we will ask chairs to do a first screening of the images that chose their “structure” upon submission and choose up to 5-6 of them. Entries can be switched between IUPAP’s structures if chairs think it’s appropriate. The chair selected images will go to the set that will be analyzed by the jury. We are thinking of setting the rules so that at least some of these images can be used on our website (we do need nice images/photos!).

We have to determine yet how we will handle the uploads that choose “Other”.

We are currently finalizing the writing of the rules and setting up the site for submissions.

Participants will have to be over 18 years of age at the time of submission, both amateur and professional photographers. Members of the IUPAP Council, Commissions, ACs or WGs, the judges, and consultants or contractors of IUPAP will not be eligible to participate.

We are planning to open the submission on February 14th and keep it open for 2 months. Members of the jury will be announced by the closing date.

We are planning to publicly announce the winners on June 30, 2022.

We will send the announcement as soon as we have all this ready. We ask you that, once you receive it, that you please redistribute it so that we can have many beautiful entries!
