




# **Room logistics**

# Uploading slides and Zoom rooms

- Talks should be uploaded to t2k.org, not to the Indico page
- Zoom rooms are available on the main t2k.org agenda and in the videoconference tab of the Indico page (if you are logged in and have registered).
- You can also see the Zoom rooms next to session names if you change the indico theme





#### The registration desk

- The meeting fee (25 CHF), party fee (45 CHF) and reservation of NP tour tickets (no fee, but limited space) should be made at the registration desk
- The registration desk will be placed next to the cafeteria in this building (40) on Monday lunchtime and Tuesday morning during the plenary session coffee break

- The fee for the party must be paid before the party starts

#### Party and tours

- The collaboration meeting party will take place at CERN in R1 on Thursday 12th May. It will be a food+drink buffet and will cost 45 CHF per person
- You have until the end of today to contact a member of the CERN LOC if you want to go and did not register. If you do not register (and pay) you cannot attend
- We have 72 spaces for neutrino platform tours which will take place on Wednesday afternoon. Tickets can be collected at the registration desk.
- The tours will show the ProtoDUNEs as well as the ND280 Upgrade ToF installed in the "baby basket"

• During the plenary sessions, the coffee breaks will be in one of two places:

• On Tuesday and Thursday: just outside the meeting rooms

• On Wednesday and Friday: between the council chamber and the main auditorium (just upstairs from where UBS is)
