


What is a journal?

The value added by a journal:

- Typesetting
- Distribution
- Preservation
- •Peer review

Peer Review in the contemporary age



A measure of its usefulness can be obtained by analyzing how papers published in journals are effective in terms of impact within the community.

An approximate measure of this effectiveness is the number of citations collected.

Form factors give a more detailed view of the impact than the simple impact factor:

- Most journals have a large tail at low impact factors
- •Most papers receive less than 10 citations after publication

The non refeered pre-print archives have a form factor close to the average journal Is some sort of "open peer review" already in place?
