My role



- Project manager for LIV.DAT and LIV.INNO Centres for Doctoral Training
 - Project communication
 - Regular contact with students to ensure everything is happening as it should be
 - Organising meetings and events
- LIV.DAT and LIV.INNO are both funded by STFC
 - LIV.DAT recruited 4 cohorts of students between 2017 and 2020, 36 students in total (23 funded by the project and 13 'associates')
 - LIV.INNO will recruit 3 cohorts of students between 2022 and 2024, another 36 students at least
 - Two of the largest data science centres in the UK







My role



- LIV.DAT and LIV.INNO studentships are half funded by STFC and half funded by industrial partners
- 4 year programs include mandatory 6 month industrial placements
- Additional skills training in e.g. project management, presentation skills, scientific writing, outreach, career planning, similar to EuPRAXIA-DN, so good opportunities for connecting activities

Supervision and mentoring expectations in LIV.DAT/LIV.INNO



- Supervisory team chosen to provide a balance of expertise in the relevant STFC science area and data intensive science.
- Each student will be provided with independent mentors on academic, industry and gender aspects
- Personal development needs analysis (career development plan) will be agreed between each student and their supervisors at the beginning of their project to include training according to needs
- These will be updated every 6 months and sent to project manager
- Meetings: Students record meeting with primary supervisor at least once per month and meet full supervisory team once per quarter

Supervision arrangements in EuPRAXIA-DN



Closely related with practice in our CDTs:

- Each Fellow will have two supervisors from their host organisation
- WP leaders will monitor progress of each project and report to the Steering Committee
- Mentors will complement supervision
- Formal reports required for each deliverable – template will be provided



Supervision arrangements in EuPRAXIA



- A Career Development plan will be agreed between each Fellow and their supervisors at the start of the program
- Career development plans should be updated every 6 months and uploaded to our secure SharePoint Platform
- Fellows and supervisors should keep in close contact with the Project
 Manager (to be appointed) throughout the project
