


#### The Great Exhibition of 1851


South Kensington science and museum district is constructed on land set aside for the Great Exhibition of 1851. Centre piece was the Crystal Palace in Hyde Park, a miracle of engineering, designed and constructed in less than a year.







#### Dinner on Wednesday – National Gallery
