## Periodic report

MuCol: period 1 M1-24 (28/2/25), period 2 M25-48 (28/2/27)

### **WHEN**

60 days after reporting period end

WHAT
Periodic Report:

**HOW** via Portal

### 1. Technical report

- Prepared by the Coordinator
- \* What was done and achieved?
- \* Which problems were encountered?
- \* How can progress so far be assessed?
- \* Were there any deviations or corrective actions?

### 2. Financial report

- Individual financial statement
- Explanation of the use of resources and information on subcontracting
  - The certificates on the financial statements (CFS)

## Periodic reporting: reviews



Reviews planned at the **end** of final reporting **period** (1 month after submission of reports). Article 21 of the GA *MuCol: months 27, 51* 









## Financial management: some advice

- Personnel Costs: KEEP TIME RECORDS of the hours worked on the action (if not working full time on an EU project)
- Meetings: collect participants' signatures (especially if you reimburse or claim travel costs)
- Any subcontracting?
  - If you need a subcontract which is not planned in the Description of Action, ask approval to the REA project officer <u>beforehand</u> as this may require an AMD
- <u>Note to the coordinator</u> **if one partner overspends**, it is up to the coordinator with the Consortium to decide internally how the EU contribution will be distributed (i.e. full amount if the overspending is due to anticipated work, or only the budget share agreed for the reporting period).

# Amendments



## Amendments

Budget transfer is allowed between beneficiaries and among existing budget categories without filing an amendment

**Action** to be implemented **as described** in Annex I

If the **change** is **significant**, an **amendment** to the GA is needed

Grant agreement duration is, as a rule, not extended (except Force Majeure)

### Amendment needed if:

- Change of Annex 1 (description of action)
- Change of Annex 2 estimated budget
- Change of coordinator or its legal status
- Change of the coordinator's bank account for payments
- Addition/removal of linked third party
- Change of action's **title**, acronym, **duration**, reporting **periods**
- Change of dissemination status of a deliverables (PU→SEN or SEN→PU)

TIP

Always contact the REA PO (Coordinator – PO) to discuss the typology and impact of change

### Communication: Promote your action and results

Inform, promote and communicate your activities and results





- · Having a well-designed strategy
- · Conveying clear messages
- Using the right media channels



From the start of the action until the end



- Engage with stakeholders
- · Attract the best experts to your team
- Generate market demand
- · Raise awareness of how public money is spent
- Show the success of European collaboration

Legal obligation of your Grant Agreement

### Dissemination: Make your results public

Open Science: knowledge and results (free of charge) for others to use

### Only to scientists?

Not only but also to others that can learn from the results: authorities, industry, policymakers, sectors of interest, civil society



Publishing your results on:

- Scientific magazines
- Scientific and/or targeted conferences
- Databases

### ( ) When?

At any time, and as soon as the action has results



- · Maximise results' impact
- · Allow other researchers to go a step forward
- Contribute to the advancement of the state of the art
- Make scientific results a common good

Legal obligation of your Grant Agreement

### **Exploitation:** Make concrete use of results

Commercial, Societal, Political Purposes



### Only by researchers?

Not only, but also:

- Industry including SMEs
- · Those that can make good use of them: authorities, industrial authorities, policymakers, sectors of interest, civil society



- · Creating roadmaps, prototypes, softwares
- · Sharing knowledge, skills, data

### (7) When?

Towards the end and beyond, as soon as the action has exploitable results



- · Lead to new legislation or recommendations
- · For the benefit of innovation, the economy and the society
- Help to tackle a problem and respond to an existing demand Legal obligation of your Grant Agreement

## Open Research Europe

### Why Open Research Europe?

- Support our open access policy and beneficiary capacity to adhere to it and also enables publishing post-grant
- Leading by example in operationalising open science principles within scientific publishing and enabling the European Research Area
- Contribute to **transparency** and **cost-effectiveness** and explore **sustainable** open access publishing business models

## What is Open Research Europe?

• A peer-reviewed <u>publishing platform</u>. <u>Not a repository</u>. Post-publication peer-review model. First you publish, then review takes place. Publication and review reports open access under CC BY licenses. <u>Optional service</u> for our beneficiaries at <u>no cost to them</u>.



## Key points on open science in Horizon Europe

- Beneficiaries must manage the digital research data generated in the action responsibly, in line with the
  - FAIR ("Findable", "Accessible", "Interoperable", Reusable") principle
- Establish + regularly update a data management plan ('DMP') for generated (and/or collected) data
- Ensure open access 'as open as possible, as closed as necessary'

## Open access to publications

- > Beneficiaries (or authors) must retain sufficient intellectual property rights to comply with the open access requirements
- Publication in venue of their choice but **publication fees are reimbursable only if publishing venue is full open access** (publication fees in hybrid venues are not reimbursed)
- Europe, the European Commission open access publishing platform

# Audits



## **Audits**



Audits can be carried out during the entire lifetime of the project, by the European Commission, not later than 2 years after the payment of the balance.

Two types of audits: financial and/or technical audits



Keeping records: Keep a clear account of the project activities during the reporting period (Article 20 Grant Agreement).

Beneficiaries must keep records and other supporting documentation up to 5 years in order to prove the proper implementation and the costs declared as eligible.




## Research Infrastructures
