A network

> Coordination of a first responders volunteer network, able to intervene in the event of cardiac arrest

Training in life-saving actions


- > First aid training

A program to public access defibrillation

- > Promoting public access to defibrillation
- > Provision of defibrillators and technical support
- Census of open access defibrillators

Graph illustrating survival percentage from cardiac arrest versus time to defibrillation (modified according to Larsen & al.2)

8000 victims of cardiac arrest in Switzerland every year

10 minutes = average time between the alert and the arrival of professional help

Survival rate decreases by 10% every minute

14% this is the average survival rate in the event of cardiac arrest in an out-of-hospital environment

+50% greater chance of survival if a witness performs resuscitation





Median age of active first responders




CHAIN OF SURVIVAL



Research has shown that the chances of survival from an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest can be significantly improved if each of the links in the chain of survival is initiated rapidly

- Develop the first responders network in Geneva, reach 1% according to international recommendations > 5000
- Retain and develop the continuing education of first responders
- Develop awareness among the population and educational initiations to young people
