

Some statistics for 2023

- 324 in-person registrations
 - 47% University of Geneva
 - 23% other academic institutions
 - 13% society
 - 9% without a listed affiliation
 - 8% industry
- More than 500 remote registrations
 - Just under 300 before the event started
 - More than 200 additional during the week
- Have not removed overlaps yet, expect 700-800 total registrations






