

Not quite 600k articles at last AAHEP, now just past 700k.


New submission system

- Just online for AAHEP4 (Apr 2011), now processed over 109k submissions, 59k replacements
- Many bug fixes and refinements last year
- Generally positive comments from users (unlike old form!)
- Added support for upload of auxiliary files and for datasets to go to Data Conservancy
- Will add support for authors.xml to pre-fill metadata


Invenio migration

 Transition for access system underway, aim to complete end 2012 or early 2013




Shared login with Inspire

- ~7k out of 124k accounts with articles (5.6%)


- Now provide both PDF and source files for download from Amazon S3
- Released "AutoTeX" code on CPAN
- SWORD uploads working well, have been promoting mechanism within repository community
- DOI and journal-ref feeds from Inspire, ADS, Elsevier,
 PTP ... happy to accept others
- Using overlap detection and classification software in supervised mode – to help spot problematic submissions

arXiv operation

- Now somewhat more separate from development as a result of Cornell library re-org
- David Ruddy is lead, Thorsten Schwander has new oversight role (50%), and two admins
- We are succeeding in being ever more efficient
 - we aren't scaling admin effort with the number of submissions
 - always looking at process and tools

arXiv sustainability

- Oya Reiger lead
- \$360k raised in 2010, \$390k so far for 2011
- Continue to refine download stats collection
- Did small scale study showing strong correlation between upload and download numbers
- Support banners
- Regular updates
