# New members of the ECR Panel

*From the ECR mandate:*

*“Members are, in general, PhD students and postdocs, either with a non-permanent contract or with up to eight years after obtaining the PhD. Up to three members, among them at least one PhD student and one postdoc, can be nominated by each ECFA country and each major laboratory represented in ECFA for a mandate of two years, extendable for another two years. Nominations are to be endorsed by Plenary ECFA. Members act as individuals, but should be able to represent the views of early-career researchers in particle physics in the nominating country.”*

*Countries with a National Lab (in LDG) can nominate an additional member from this lab.*
