# **DID YOU KNOW?**

The oldest communal theatre in Europe was built in Hvar in the year 1612.

The smallest cathedral in the world is said to be located in Nin, near Zadar.

One of the world's first **hydroelectric power plant** was "Iskrice", made in the city of Šibenik, on the river Krka, Croatia - 1895.

The city of Zadar is home to the **world's first Sea Organ** that creates its music only by the action of the wind and waves.

Croatia's currency, kuna, was named after a small agile animal with brown fur, marten in English, based on the use of marten pelts as units of value in medieval trading. Heads of the larger coins feature a running marten.

Dalmatians, the breed of dog featured in the movie 101 Dalmatians, are named after Dalmatia, in which most of the Croatian Adriatic is located.

Although it has a population of only 23 people, **Hum in Istria**, Croatia is officially a town and the Guinness World Record holder for the smallest town in the world.

A friendly and very common greeting in Croatia is Bog or Bok - both for Hi and Bye. The literal meaning of Bog is - God.

Some parts od **The White House** were built of Croatian stone from the island of Brač (in 1902/1952 renovation), as well as the New Palace (Vienna, Austria), the Parliament building (in Vienna, Austria), the Parliament Building (Budapest, Hungary) and the palace of Roman emperor Diocletian (Split, Croatia).




