- Central role of communication between the beneficiaries and the European Commission
- Supervision and coordination of the scientific and technical progress
- Supervision and coordination of the project periodic and final reporting, including use of resources and distribution of funding
- Organisation of project annual meetings and consortium bodies meetings
- Contractual and administrative implementation (e.g. GA amendments, NDA signature with AP members, ...)



# **Consortium bodies**

### • Governing Board (GB), decision-making body

- 1 representative per Partner (6 members)
- ~ 2 meetings per year
- Examples: vote for GA amendment, or for inclusion of a new Partner in the Consortium
- Work Package (WP) Leaders, lead and coordinate the technical activities
  - 1 representative per WP
  - ~4 meetings per year






# **Consortium bodies**

- Project Office (PO), supervisory body, report to and be accountable to the GB
  - Project leader, deputy Project leader, Project assistant, technical experts
  - ~4 meetings per year
  - Examples: digital tools, template for reporting, contact with the Project Officer, coordinate the execution of all WPs.
- <u>Advisory Panel (AP)</u>, advise the GB on technical and strategic matters with a focus on Exploitation, and provide independent assessment and feedback concerning the advancement of the project. One AP meeting per year is planned.



# **Project Reporting Timeline**




The periodic reports to the EC includes a technical and a financial part. Beneficiaries should report on the progress of the work and costs claimed.
