
Nagasaki City Area Overview



Around the current Doza area, there were many play houses. They were called "Shibaya" by people that time. The place where many play houses existed was called "Shibayanji".

Lord of Doza who interacted with people from various cultures

Tokutaro who belonged to the 6th generation of the Nagami family was abom in 1890. He was a person of culture who got familiar with pictures and partituliar of many of his works to the world. It is also said that the fox god protected soldiers of the Doza-machi during the Russo- Japanese War. 

From Nagasaki station to the airport

- You can take a limousine bus to go to Nagasaki airport (domestic flights for Narita/Kansai).
- The bus station is located on the first floor of "Ken-ei bus terminal" building.
- You can buy tickets at the bus terminal, or pay 1200 yen to the bus driver when you get on the bus (they accept only cash and don't have change). You cannot reserve seats.
- Buses leave every 20 minutes. It takes about 45 minutes to reach Nagasaki airport.
