

Dejima, a small fan-shaped artificial island built in 1636 in the bay of Nagasaki, served as Japan's only open window to Europe in the period of seclusion during the Edo era, and played a vital role in the modernization of Japan, including cultivation of scientific knowledge in medicine and physics.

Mostly accessible by tram line










From Nagasaki station to the airport

- You can take a limousine bus to go to Nagasaki airport (domestic flights for Narita/Kansai).
- The bus station is located on the first floor of "Ken-ei bus terminal" building.
- You can buy tickets at the bus terminal, or pay 1200 yen to the bus driver when you get on the bus (they accept only cash and don't have change). You cannot reserve seats.
- Buses leave every 20 minutes. It takes about 45 minutes to reach Nagasaki airport.
