
How confident you are in Alpine skiing (pisted slopes)? Quel est votre niveau de confiance en ski alpin (pistes tracées) ?







### **Base Material**





Required equipment Basic 🔻

- DVA + Snow Shovel + avalanche probe
- . Warm hat, scarf, sweater, hooded anorak, waterresistant clothing (windbreaker, balaclava), warm gloves, ski pants, gaiters, warm socks, helmet
- Ski touring Shoes
- · Skis with touring bindings (downhill and free-heel), poles with wide baskets and climbing skins (coated with glue), Ski crampons.
- · Backpack with front strap for skis
- Sunglasses with protective lenses, sunscreen lotion, lip balm, snow mask
- · Wax, space blanket, whistle
- · Waterflask, Thermos bottle, pocket knife, toilet paper
- First aid kit (elasticated support bandage, adhesive tape, bandages, gauze swabs, aspirine or paracetamol, safety pins, Arnica 9CH pills, etc.)
- I.D. card or passport (you need one for passing borders...)
- Mobile phone (switched on but on silence mode), GPS if you have one











# Ski touring season 23/24 in a nutshell

### 6 active instructors

- we keep running in sub-optimal mode
- + 1 remote since Arek has left the region\*
- 1 MF1 refreshed

### Usual section safety days!


- Three days + outings
- All members trained (38)
- 14 outings (4-7p always full!)
  - 172 person-x-day-out (-1 w.r.t last year)
  - 2 cancelled outings...
  - -9 outings less w.r.t last years

### Cap to 45 members with NO accidents!

- ~ as per 2022/2023...
- Section fee kept (55€) (52€ this year)

















### 23/24 Season Wrap Up


- Challenging seasons lately (important global warming impact)
  - not allways easy ski days
  - season discontinuity
  - unsafe conditions (as always, but accentuated)
- Trying to keep **diversity** of **outings** –from beginner (in rando) to level to S4-.
- Car-sharing / <a href="https://caroster.io">https://caroster.io</a> in all outings
- Great demand (Section fully booked in 4 days). We keep places limited to 45 to allow for enough outings
- !Urgent need! to get certified monitors. (2 in pipeline + 1 potential)
  - Lost 2 partially trained MF1!
  - FFS has Advanced the Training so they can become operational during the season (and not at the end)
- Important to rethink social part since Covid for 24/25.




