

Analysis models of experiments: CMS / ATLAS


- >50% of analyses are using ntuple-like format for analysis

C++ or Python


- While initial object corrections are applied, still requires additional scale corrections (for individual physics objects) and event weights
- Lots of iterations at each "arrow", highly-parallelised batch jobs



Analysis models of experiments: LHCb



- Results corrected, rather than data
- Standard environments on CVMFS used instead of containerised environments
- Whole workflow can be run interactively/on HPC



Questions to be addressed

- Can we consolidate our experience and tools?
- Which tooling do we need to develop/share?
 - batch cluster profiles
 - Rucio and XRootD tools/scripts
 - Authentication
