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Brief CV

- I started my career in the DELPHI experiment at LEP, where I participated to the operation and upgrades of the vertex detector and to tau lepton physics studies. I currently participate in the ATLAS experiment at CERN's Large Hadron Collider, where I studied the decay of the Higgs boson in $\tau^+\tau^-$ pairs and now I am involved in the construction of the new silicon pixel detector of the ATLAS ITk for the High-Luminosity LHC. I am also looking at monolithic detector development for tracking at a future circular e⁺e⁻ Higgs factory.
- I have been working in strong connection with electronics groups and designers since 1999 when I started a post-doc on the development of the pixel detectors now taking data in the ATLAS experiment. I have been involved in the FTK project, for track reconstruction with associative memories and I am a member of the RD53 and ARCADIA Collaborations. The Milano group I represent in the CB is also involved in silicon photonics, development of high-performance timing chips, power distribution design for ATLAS LAr calorimeter and the Dune experiment.
- I am also member of the DRD3 Collaboration

I am not a hardcore electronics developer, being more from the "user" side, my profile is complementary and can bring a new point of view in the step of the collaboration formal building process





Statement

- Particle Physics is even more a global challenge now than when the large LHC collaboration started.
 Designing new and more performant detectors requires access to costly technologies and very specialized expertise, which is always scarce. The DRD model implemented as an ECFA action, is a way to address these issues which may change the paradigm of how the R&D in the technologies needed for the progress of Nuclear and Particle Physics is organized.
- Indeed, to me DRD7 should target to become the center of attraction of the best experts in Electronics within the Nuclear and Particle Physics community. I expect that, if the DRD model proves attractive, additional forces with strong capabilities and bright ideas would like to join our collaborative framework, and this will be a key ingredient in pursuing the DRD7 mandate.
- I am committed to **working together** with the steering committee, with the future governance and with the funding agencies or institute representatives, to make DRD7 a strong and successful Collaboration.

I am really grateful to the steering committee for setting the DRD7 path, their expertise and dedication is an asset for the collaboration.

In particular I appreciate the structure focused on Work Packages and the strong connection between membership and contribution to deliverables





Priority issues

- If elected as CB chair, my top priority will be setting up the **collaboration rules** so that we can smoothly proceed to signing a framework MoU that will allow to **officially start** the working projects we have already signed in.
 - define how DRD7 would like to customize the generic DRD MoU, temporarily set during the MoU approval process
 - for some institutes this is important to apply for fundings
- My duty as CB Chair will be to prepare a path in which all **participating institutes will feel involved** in the definition of the collaboration structure and could express their preference among the viable options.
 - Governance structure
 - The Steering Group, with its competences, is a specific structure of DRD7
 - The collaboration needs to have an open discussion and explicit decision about that
 - Election rules must be agreed
 - Common funds
 - Controversial issue: an overhead, but it may also support an effort of collaboration building
 - Process to accept new institutes
 - Process to call and approve new projects





Actions

I would like to organize the next steps if elected

- CB meeting in October
 - discussion of collaboration rules
 - organize offline vote on major items submitted to the board
 - approval of CB Chair Deputy
 - (Resource Coordinator)
- CB meeting in November
 - approval of text of the collaboration rules
 - need enough time for the draft to be circulated and commented
 - start of the process of nomination for Steering Committee/Spokepersons
 - open a competition for the DRD7 logo ☺
 - (set up of the Resource Board)
- Elections in December/January, depending on the outcome of the nomination process
- CB meeting late January/beginning of February
 - endorsement of appointments by the governance (WP coordinators, deputies...)
