CERN access card



... has to be

- worn visibly all the time and
- returned at the end of your stay.

If you leave the CERN campus (e.g. for going to Geneva), take it with you as you will need it to enter again!



Lunch Checks

Pre-paid card ("**lunch checks**") to pay for your meals

- loaded with a fixed amount of money: 40 CHF per day to pay for breakfast, lunch, and dinner
- has to be returned at the end of your stay
- does not work at the vending machines and in the restaurant located in the Prevessin campus

- Language: French (& English, Spanish, Portuguese, ...)

Safety on-site

There is a lot of **traffic** (trucks, buses, cars, bikes) at CERN and accidents happen regularly. Moreover, there are several **construction sites**.

Please be cautious and only walk on the dedicated pedestrian paths and crossings.

Safety in the experimental area

In building 157 ...
