

TRÓFEA GRILL





1133 Kárpát utca 23.



1137 Budapest, Pozsonyi utca 12.



- Distance from NIIFI HQ: a 12 minute walk.




KÁNAÁN RESTAURANT

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION


The **Airport of Budapest** is now called Liszt Ferenc Airport. To get to the city from the airport one option is to use the shuttle service. It is cheaper than ordering a taxi, but it's more inconvenient. The flat rate fee is equivalent to about 10 euro per person and the Minibus drops you off at your final destination. Taxi is faster, but more expensive (equivalent to about 20-30 euro). Cheapest taxi service is called **Főtaxi** (about 20 euro per cab, flat rate) - look for the "Főtaxi" booth just when getting out of the terminal building at the arrival level. Anyway, don't forget to exchange some money still in the terminal building in order to have Hungarian currency (HUF= Hungarian forint) in your pocket. That's needed in case of all transfer options. (Note: paying the taxi fare with credit card is not very common)

- Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Brunei, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Croatia, Guatemala, Holy See, Honduras, Hong Kong, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Macao, Malaysia, Mexico, Monaco, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Panama, Romania, Salvador, San Marino, Singapore, South Korea, Switzerland, USA, Uruguay, Venezuela.
