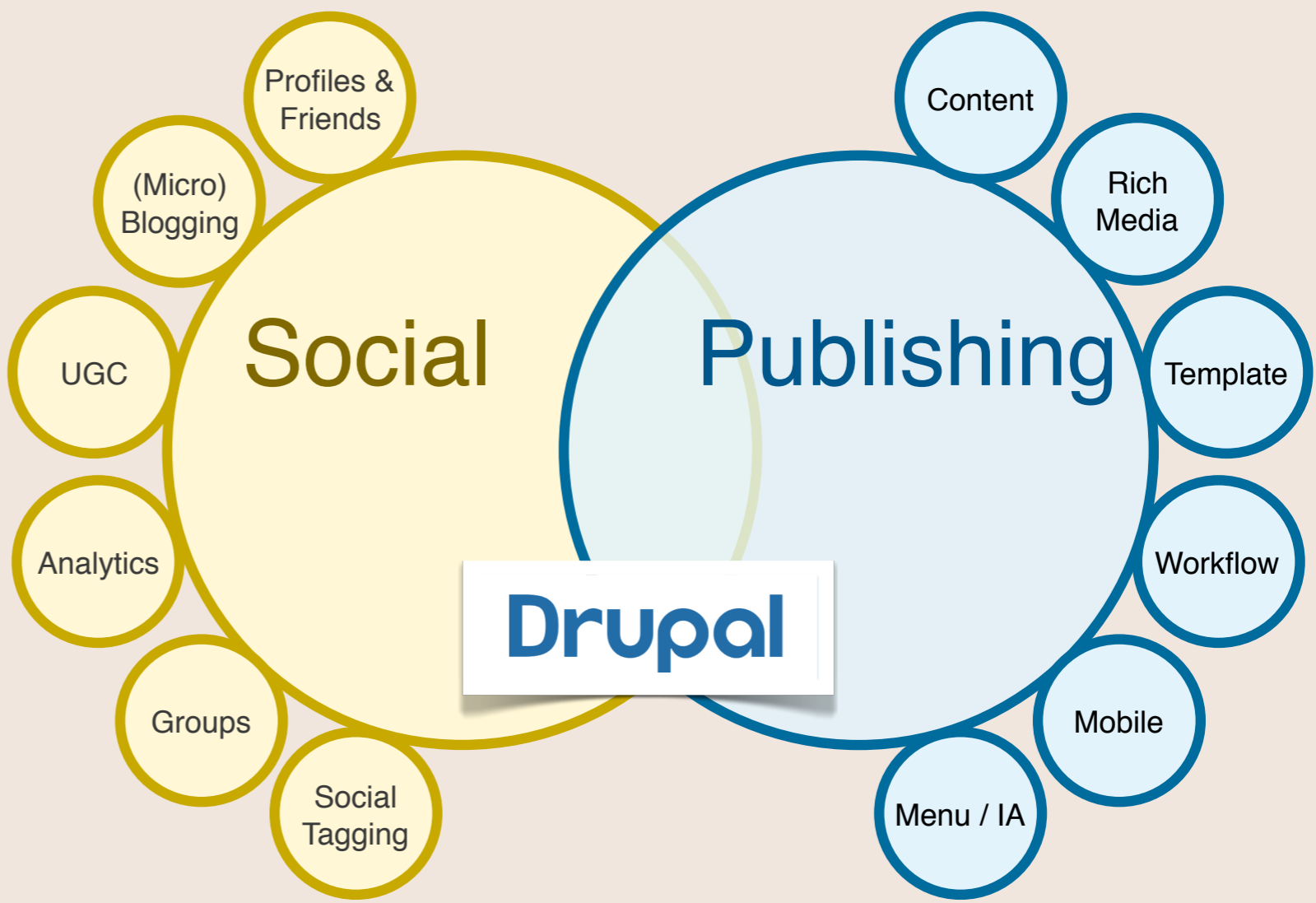


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The “85% Plus” solution for large organizations:

- no need to reinvent the wheel

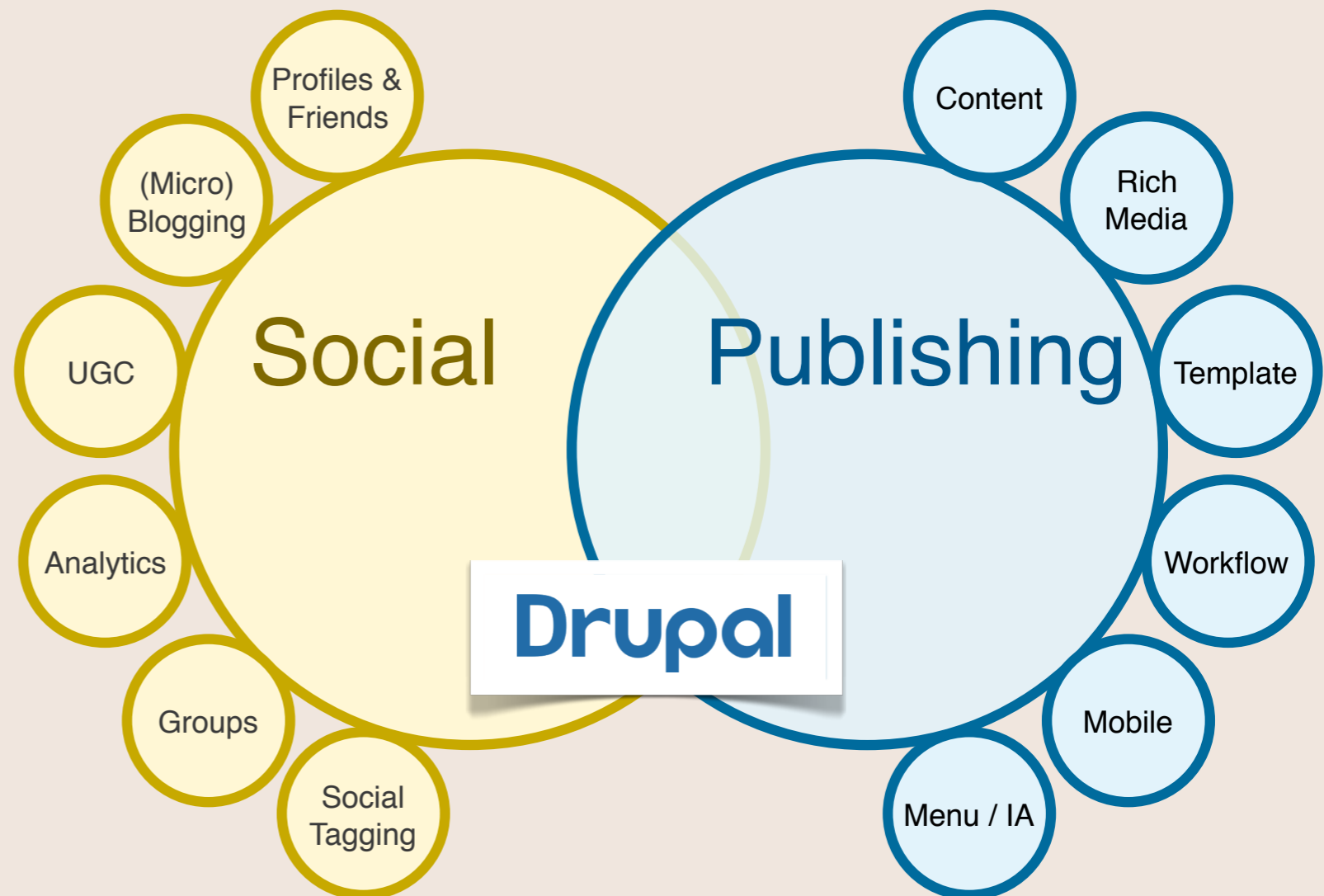


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Faster “time to market”

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Behind all that great code is an amazing community!

- millions of websites running drupal
- almost 1,000,000 community members on drupal.org
- **over 10,000 contributed module developers & 15,000+ modules**
- **almost 1,000 core developers of the platform**
- thousands of services companies
- Drupal has a very robust and thriving ecosystem

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Organizations are Reinventing the Wheel

....behind closed doors

- Creating incompatible solutions to the same problems
- Not releasing these solutions back to the community



Large organizations not meaningfully engaging community



Participation Roadblocks

Even organizations with the best intentions, the desire to give back, often fail to do so

- Short term focus - desire to quickly solve a problem, no time to put in “extra effort” now (at a huge cost later)
- Don't release code b/c they want to add “polish” for release to the public - but never have time to actually do that
- The fear that if you do release something, you won't have the time to support and engage the community after the fact

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Acquia is “Giving Back”

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LSD: Collaborative Projects

The major focus of the group is on projects

- Identify common problems through member input & feedback
 - ongoing assessment: onboarding, quarterly meetings, etc.
- Anonymize and aggregate common needs, into “Strategic Areas of Interest”
- Helps define project roadmap for existing and future members

Economy of scale: Identify strategic projects based on shared needs and common problems.



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LSD: Strategic Areas of Investment

Content Authoring

Improved authoring experience: true wysiwyg previews, in-place (contextual) editing of content, enhanced media support, management of content, etc.

Mobile

Everything from robust SDKs for native apps on iOS and Android, sample apps and documentation, to responsive design for front-end and back-end (admin) tools for mobile browsing and authoring (anon and auth), enhanced media support (e.g. image cropping)

Content Staging

Ability to preview a large set of changes to a site, as a given user/role, at a specific point in time or based on a set of changes tagged as a collection, and to schedule the release of these changes at a given time.



LSD: Strategic Areas of Investment

Performance & Scalability

Making Drupal faster & more cost effective to scale and run

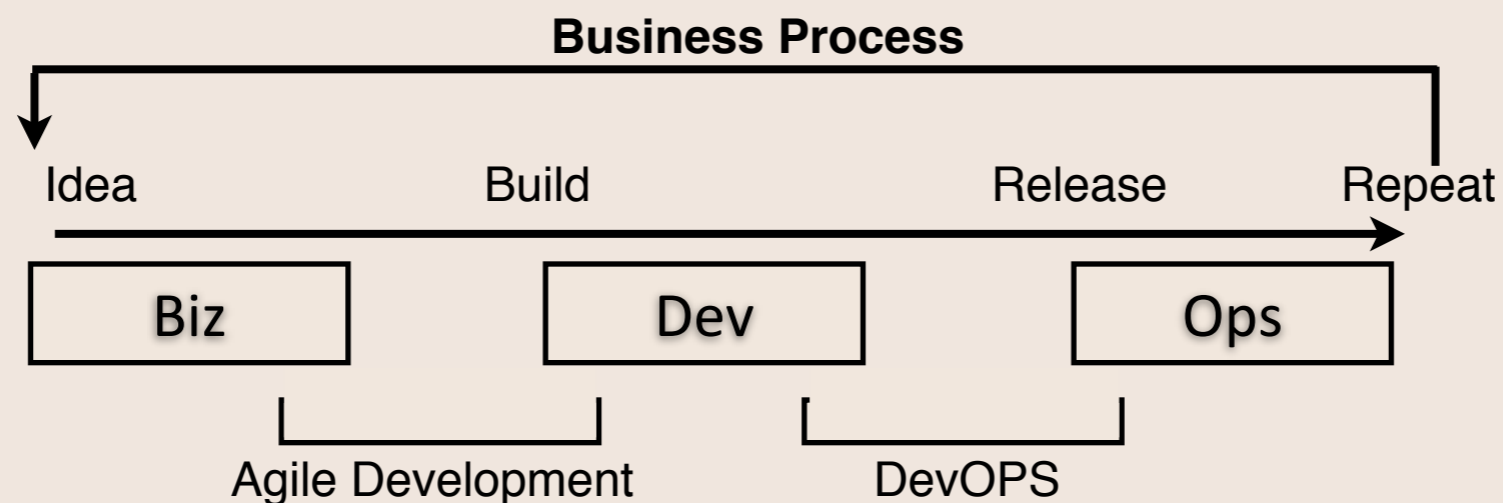
Security

Making sure you don't get hacked or cracked (and then sacked...)

DEVOPS

Extension of agile: improved collaboration between dev, qa, ops, etc.

Reliable software releases through test, and deployment automation



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LSD: Many Types of Collaborative Dev

We take on different types of projects

- group projects that LSD executes on
- peer to peer collaboration
- acceleration and funding / sponsorships

Each type requires its own methodology

- always provide proj. & program management
- ensure success thru engagement oversight

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LSD: Collaborations - Group Projects

Content Staging Initiative (CSI)

- Identified by majority of LSD members as a pressing need
- A large project, many had planned to do this on their own

Status:

- Discovery completed, done publicly
- Development almost done!
- Integration support starting Sept.
- Meaningfully and successfully proved the model

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LSD: Group Projects - Goals

Identify strategic & meaningful projects - common problems

develop generic “85% plus” solutions

- Related to but NOT Professional Services
- do the project openly in the community
- release the code to the community
- help support that code to ensure broad adoption
- support integration, provide a path to get “90% plus”
- provide an upgrade path - when possible

upfront costs: range from 10% to 40% vs. “going it alone”

- depending on size of project, number of members, etc.

customization costs: range from 20% to 40% vs. “going it alone”

- depending on complexity, amount of customization, etc.



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LSD: Group Projects - Business Case

“85% Plus Solution” - Shared Development Costs

upfront costs: range from 10% to 40% vs. “going it alone”

- depending on size of project, number of members, etc.

customization costs: range from 20% to 40% vs. “going it alone”

- depending on complexity, amount of customization, etc.

total cost savings: range from 20% to 70% cheaper vs. “going it alone”

AND you get a long term solution you’ll get more value out of over time

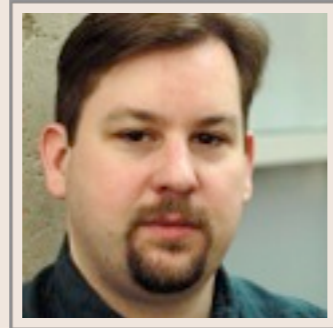


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A Related Example: Views

Views - most popular contributed module funded by Sony



Earl Miles (merlinofchaos)

- Sony hired Earl to build out views to free up their development team and empower non technical staff to have much greater control over their sites
- Sony could have built views internally - they didn't have to release the code
- The community has added millions of dollars worth of enhancements
- Sony NEVER could have created such a system, even if they had invested more money than the community added; a SIGNIFICANTLY great value / system



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LSD: Peer to Peer Projects

Facilitating members working together

Companies working together, with their own resources, to solve problems; just starting with these types of efforts, and have two experiments starting:

Localization of Content, Translation Tools

- Ability to customize content based on a users location (images, and text)
- Translation tools to improve & expedite the process / improve management

Images

- Image cropping and resizing tools for responsive design
- Focal points, don't crop, dynamic generation, pre-generation of thumbs

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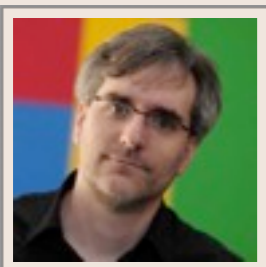

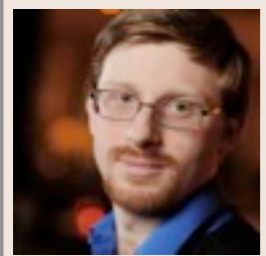
Increasing long term value, maximum return on investment

- More forward looking investments - “future fund” focused on Drupal 8 initiatives

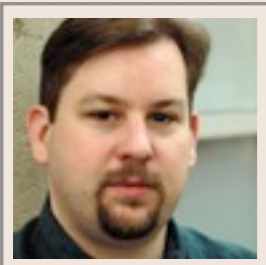
