How to get to CERN:

CERN is situated on the French-Swiss border, approximately 10 kilometers from the Geneva city center and 5 kilometers from the Geneva Airport. More information on how to get to CERN can be found [here](#).

Upon your arrival, **take a free public transport ticket** at the airport from the machine you will find at the exit to the baggage collection hall, just before customs control.

There are several ways to get to CERN.

- 1) Bus Y (direction: Val-Thoiry) will take you straight to CERN from the airport
- 2) Alternatively, you can take bus 57 (direction: Gare de Meyrin), bus 28 (direction: Parfumerie) or bus 23 (direction: Ziplo) to "Blandonnet" where you have to change to a tram 18 (direction: CERN).
- 3) Free shuttle from Geneva airport to CERN runs from Monday to Friday 8 a.m. – 7p.m.
