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“ Einstein spoke so often about God that Bohr reportedly asked him

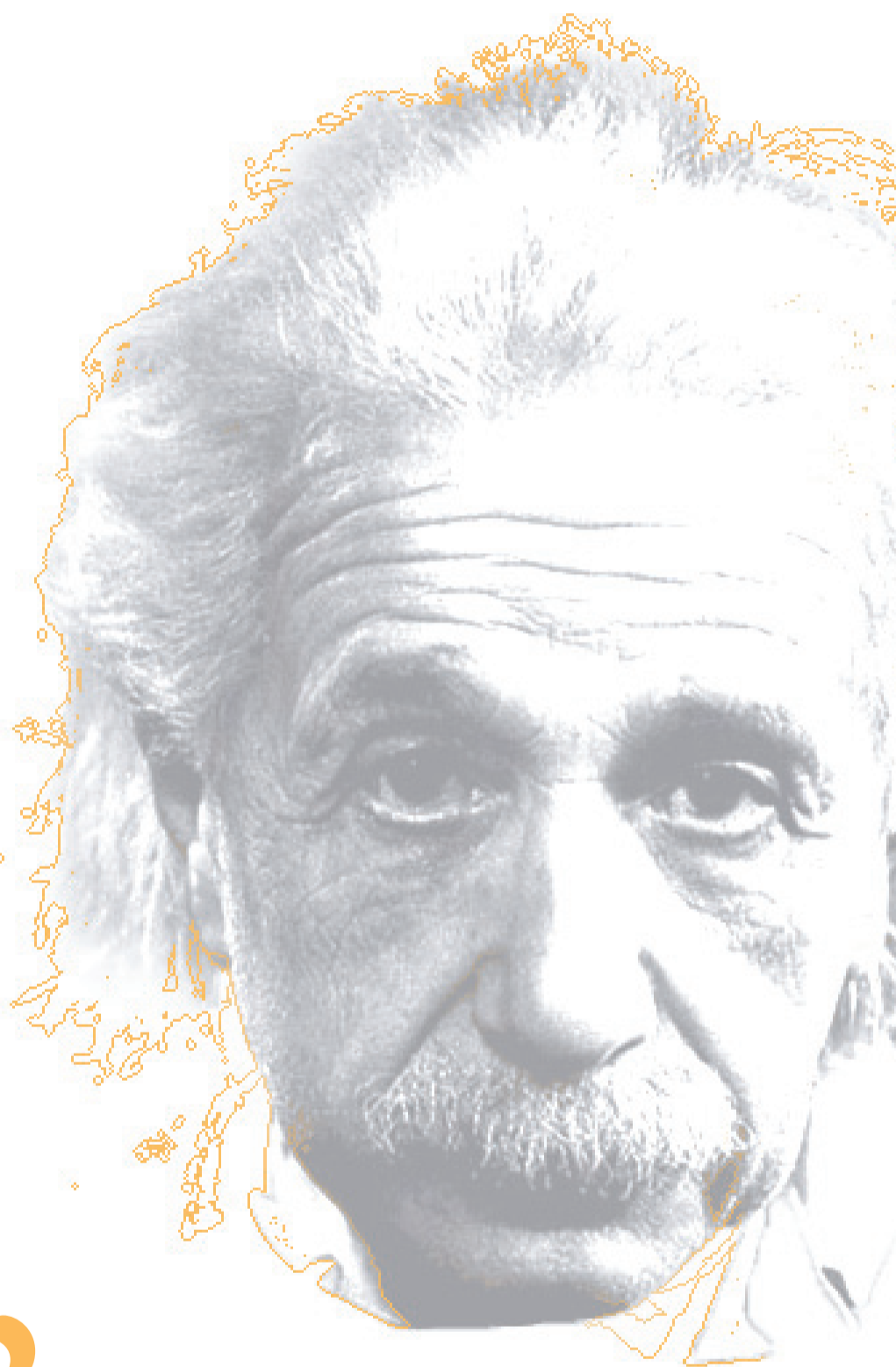
'Stop telling God what to do'.
