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Motivation

- improve organisation of our work flow
 - → collect vague ideas: don't lose ideas after discussions...
 - → overview of ongoing work: who works on what? avoid duplicate work
 - → keep track of priorities:
 what is urgent, what can be done later?
- we investigated some possible tools
- we present a preliminary structure here
- ⇒ stimulate discussion on optimising PyHEADTAIL development

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B. prioritise

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- → identify core features to implement
- → extract ideas (from mind map?)
- ⇒ phrase problem, define issue

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- → identify who works on what?
- \rightarrow keep track of changes
- ⇒ follow established procedure

A. Creative Brainstorming

- → document the reason
- ⇒ use central online mind map?
 - everyone adds ideas
 - rapidly update mind map after discussions
 - ⇒ avoid losing ideas
 - Suggest mindmeister.com (open source alternative: XMind.net)
 - web interface, supports many platforms

B. Prioritise

- → identify core features to implement
- → extract ideas (from mind map?)
- ⇒ phrase problem, define issue
 - issue: description, priority, duration estimate
 - ⇒ see others working on the same issue
 - suggest: trello.com
 - board featuring parallel lists
 - lists contain cards
 - labels may denote priority (desirable/low/high/urgent)
 - cards $\stackrel{1:1}{\longleftrightarrow}$ issues $\stackrel{1:1}{\longleftrightarrow}$ github.com branches (feature based)
 - → "shared repository model", link

C. Process Tracking I

- → identify who works on what?
- → keep track of changes
- ⇒ follow established procedure
 - github commits ^{zanker?}
 — trello card comments
 - organise trello lists as progress stages (?)
 - 1. To Do (prioritised)
 - 2. Implementation in Progress
 - 3. Testing
 - 4. Successfully Tested & Released
 - history documented (trello: "activities", github: commits)


C. Process Tracking II

- version control (github: tags, releases)
 - \rightarrow 1.1.x for bug fixes (third number)
 - \rightarrow 1.x for new features (second number)
 - → perhaps leave the first one for the moment ;-)

C. Process Tracking II

- version control (github: tags, releases)
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 - → perhaps leave the first one for the moment ;-)
- trello vs. github bug tracking
 - → trello: more overview & flexibility? (soon-to-be established procedure incl. testing)
 - → break down feature development into steps: trello card checklists
 - → github already integrated management

Last but not least: git branching



- feature based branches
- develop branch
- master branch
- → merging only with
 - \$ git merge ... --no-ff
- \Rightarrow clean master branch
