




La Sorbonne : a central and historically rich place shared by four Universities : Paris I, III, IV and V the Rectorate of the Paris Academy, the Ecole des Chartes and the Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes.





A 2D roman lattice with the origin located at the heighest place for measurements between the n° 172 and 174 of the rue St Jacques and with modules of 300 roman feet (one roman foot = 0.296 m)



The Sorbonne dates back from 1253: a college is created within the Paris University by **Robert de Sorbon,** chaplain and confessor of St Louis.

The University is already autonomous (police and justice)

from a decree by Philippe Auguste in 1200 and a with the help of the pope in 1231 as an ecclesiatic corporation. Often on strike during the XV century to keep its privileges.


Sorbonne headmaster in 1622.


Rebuilt the Sorbonne and the church where his grave lies.



In his 1885 project, the architect Henri-Paul Nénot, kept the XVII century spirit, with the sundial, the slate roofs and the attic windows of the old Sorbonne

Between 1893 and 1903, he built around the main courtyard, the new Faculty with the Richelieu gallery parallel to the rue StJacques, the Grand Library and the Richelieu Amphitheater
