Bryan Webber is Emeritus Professor of Theoretical Physics at the University of Cambridge, UK. He was an undergraduate at Oxford University and a graduate student at the University of California at Berkeley. He was head of the theoretical high-energy physics group at the Cavendish Laboratory, Cambridge from 1973 until 2010. His main research interest is in the strong interactions described by quantum chromodynamics. He works closely with experimentalists and has made many contributions at the interface between theory and experiment, including the Herwig event generator, new jet-finding algorithms, event shape variables and models for non-perturbative QCD. He is currently working on improving the precision of event generators and searches for physics beyond the Standard Model.
