Which “other” documentation



- Internal documents
 - Component document (+architecture document)
 - Testing related documentsFor project developers
- Reference documentation
 - Doxygen
 - LXR
 - ViewCVSFor developers and users
- User Web and Project Portal
 - discussed separately



User documentation



- Each document should:
 - Have an EDITOR, responsible to get it done. Like for a software package.
 - Be in CVS and versioned.
- Use the same tools and have the structure so can be supported centrally.
- Give homogeneity to the projects of the Application Area.



Proposed User Documentation



- Release Notes
 - Described what is new or changed in the current release. Already done by Pool and Seal we define it as template in HTML.
- FAQ
 - Reduces of 90% the requests. Needs to be done from beginning.
- Workbook
 - For developers needing to know how to perform some actions, set of "how to" documents, tutorials, etc.
- Users Guide
 - Documentation for the end user, to get started and see all main functionalities of the software.
 - With working examples delivered on the web.
 - Easily editable, with all the features needed to make it nice.
 - Must be printable, spell checked with and controlled layout.



What to use



- Release Notes
 - Simple HTML template with some fixed headings
- FAQ
 - The one of Savannah is basic but we can use it. Current choice.
 - Better solutions are welcome, if they are simple
- Workbook
 - Template available by J.Beringer
- User Guide
 - Templates are available
 - Root manual has an excellent template by I.Antcheva
 - Simple to use, but all features are there



How to proceed



- Each project should nominate editors for its documents (RN, FAQ, UG, WB). Editors will delegate parts of the document, but make sure follows the policies.
- All templates are available, we just take what is used already in existing projects
- Feedback from the editors will help to improve the templates, but should not prevent from using them
- FAQ and WB can be started early in the project, RN at first release, UG for first public release
- User documentation should be part of the QA validation like testing, verification, etc.
