
Current activity, continued

- HEP X Zeuthen Spring 2016
- > 1.6 releases are cut from the stable-1_6_x git branch
- > There are two other active branches:
 - devel-1_7_x
 - > actually the "stable" branch for MS Windows releases
 - stalled
 - master
 - > Any new code has to be checked in here first
 - Will eventually be branched to stable-1_8_x
 - next stable release series
 - needs consolidation
 - ETA: ~Christmas for years
 - Next big feature to land on master after branching off 1.8 is rxgk or was?
- > There are four persons left who contribute steadily
 - and a handful who contribute occasionally



Problems



- > The decreasing number of commits isn't that alarming
 - The master branch is being stabilized for 1.8
 - Open Hub doesn't show the stable branch
- The decreasing number of contributors is
 - Getting new code reviewed has become a real problem
 - > Getting new code fixed if review shows it's necessary is even harder
 - Without this, it can't go in
 - Slows down development on master and stable branch
- Code skew between master and stable has become significant
- We recently lost the developer who kept the Linux client afloat
 - No successor



The Linux Client



- Significant effort required to keep up with the Linux kernel
 - Changes affecting the OpenAFS client with almost every release
 - > ~ every two months, see this presentation from the last workshop:

http://workshop.openafs.org/afsbpw15/talks/thursday/dionne-linux-openafs-v2.pdf

- No OpenAFS release yet with support for Linux 4.4
 - Nobody working on supporting Linux 4.5, and 4.6 is due soon
- No immediate problem with Enterprise Linux Distributions
 - RHEL & clones, probably SLE, debian stable
- > Real problem with others
 - Fedora, Ubuntu even Ubuntu LTS
 - > changes backported within weeks
 - > no stable client yet in 14.04 LTS & 16.04 LTS



Other Platforms

MS Windows

- End of the the road ahead (?)
- Auristor installer "available soon"

> OS X

- 3rd party installers available from SNA, Auristor
- Code supports recent releases
 - still some headaches
- Packaging support in the pipeline

Solaris

still being maintained

> *BSD

being maintained (but limited client maturity?)

> IRIX





Summary



- The project is still alive
 - The foundation is working on its future
 - recently appointed new security officer + deputies
 - legal work required to sign client installers
- But several problems due to lack of manpower
 - The next stable release series is overdue
 - rxgk is overdue
 - The client is no longer coping with Linux kernel changes
