
Olomouc is said to occupy the site of a Roman fort founded in the imperial period, the original name of which, *Iuliomontium* (Mount Julius), would be gradually corrupted to the present form. Although this account is not documented except as oral history, archaeological excavations close to the city have revealed the remains of a Roman military camp dating from the time of the Marcomannic Wars of the late 2nd century.

Quark (dairy product)

Quark is a type of fresh dairy product, common in the cuisines of German-speaking countries (Germany, Austria, Switzerland). northern Europe (Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Sweden), the Netherlands, [1][2][3] Hungary, Albania, Israel, of Slavic peoples (e.g. Czechs, Slovaks, Poles, Russians, Ukrainians and Belarusians and Serbs), and of Ashkenazi Jews. [4] It is made by warming soured milk until the desired degree of curdling is met, and then straining it.[5] It can be classified as fresh acid-set cheese. [6] though in some countries it is traditionally considered a distinct fermented milk product.[7] Traditional quark is made without rennet, but in some modern dairies rennet is added.[8] It is soft, white and unaged, and usually has no salt added.

Dictionaries usually translate it as curd cheese, cottage cheese or sometimes farmer cheese. In Germany, quark and cottage
