

Access rules for visits to the ISOLDE hall

Updated version September 2015

According to **GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTION GSI-OHS1**, October 2011

General:

- Entrance and exit via building 170 (Jura side). Please note that the only access is via stairs, which can make entering to the hall difficult or even impossible for people with reduced mobility.
- Maximum **12 visitors per guide**
- **No eating, no drinking**, and no touching equipment
- Areas with **magnetic hazard**: no visitors with pacemaker, defibrillator, electronic medicine dispenser, hearing aid, metal implant
- Stay within standard **itinerary**
- Visits **above 5 people** are announced to **TSO** (M. Lozano Benito), **BE-RSO** (F. Pirotte), **RPO** (A. Dorsival), **GLIMOS** (M. Kowalska), **ISOLDE Techn. Coord.** (R. Catherall)

Guide (escort):

- Is authorized to access ISOLDE
- Knows ISOLDE potential hazards, safety instructions, and actions in case of emergency
- Wears safety shoes and a helmet (when visiting HIE-ISOLDE)
- Carries passive and operational dosimeters

Visitors:

- Wear **flat, closed shoes and a helmet** (when visiting HIE-ISOLDE)
- Are **not below 16 years old**
- **Pregnant women are not authorized** to enter
