
## ONTHE ROAD...

### LOCAL GUIDE

- We visited a lot of places this week
- Generally the food was good, the company pleasant and the atmosphere convivial
  - But of course, we are far from finished!



### CORE SOFTWARE AND TRIGGER

- Re-entrant should be the goal for new code
  - The framework supports thread safety by design, so our goal should be that any competent code can write a re-entrant algorithm
- Many old patterns are deprecated
  - Sami provided a way to migrate incidents to the new framework, but still we want to get away from them as much as possible
- Conditions is probably harder to solve than incidents they are a core part of what we do
  - Hackathon made progress on how to tackle this
- EventViews implementation
  - Big decisions on dynamic vs. static views
  - Personally, dynamic views look horribly complicated to do generically
    - No other experiment seems to need them

## ALGORITHMIC CODE

- Software review is progressing (albeit slowly)
  - Re-learn the code, push awareness of AthenaMT
- People are really starting to migrate algorithms now
  - Uncovering all kinds of interesting cases we might not have foreseen
  - Great! Feeds back into the framework design
- Simulation makes excellent progress
  - Multi-threaded simulation looks to be almost home memory scaling is so great we almost look lightweight for once!
- Digitisation continues to look hard
  - Memory and i/o are not areas in which we look rich...

# QUALITY AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- ARM port is a huge deal
  - Always something that was supposed to be 'not so hard', but finally we did it
- CMake has been born and is unlocking many other improvements
  - Need to broaden our expertise
- Jenkins is coming should pay off handsomely
- Software Quality is really important and awareness is much higher now
  - Tools are great, but people need a roadmap too
  - Training, documentation and good examples
- git will be a big deal
  - Not a change of tool, a change of culture


