





AFT - led by Chris Roderick, and currently in production & active development.





Background & Motivation for ACW

In order to avoid development chaos, duplication of efforts, libraries, build and deployment processes – ending up with single-expert systems and a maintenance nightmare...

Started Accsoft Commons Web (Common Web software in the accelerator domain) in January 2016.

"Weekly meetings bringing together experts / active developers in an attempt to share development news/problems/solutions

Aim: streamline development, ensure common choices (process, styles, UI components) etc.

ACW Purpose & Goals

Desire to have:

Common look and feel for all of our applications – give our users a familiar and consistent user experience.

A basis with which to form an agile workforce - having the flexibility to move people to different projects according to the needs, but with out a high initial learning cost.

... means same technologies, development tools, plus development, build and deployment processes...

ACW Practices & Results

We are all using the same technologies and architecture (see next talk).

Maintain an inventory of 3rd party components we are using for what.

We are all developing and deploying using the same tools.

Agreed that everything should be reviewed – code reviews (Crucible) often include external developers (not in the immediate project team).

The whole process (weekly meetings, code reviews, coffee discussions, etc.) brought together members of distinct teams to work together to solve common problems in common ways.

Led to concrete development of:

- Ready-to-run template for new Web projects (ACW Seed Project)
- Specific artifacts / components to easily share / distribute / profit from further evolution & maintenance.
