



**George M. Langford** is a nationally known cell biologist and neuroscientist, as well as dean of Syracuse University's College of Arts and Sciences. Since coming to SU in 2008, he has helped build Arts and Sciences into one of the nation's premier residential liberal arts colleges.

Throughout his multi-faceted career, George Langford has maintained an interdisciplinary approach to teaching, research, service, and enterprise. Prior to SU, he served as dean of the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. Before that, he was the Ernest Everett Just Professor of Natural Sciences and professor of biological sciences, both at Dartmouth College. Dean Langford has also served on the faculties of the University of Massachusetts-Boston, Howard University, and The University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, in addition to holding leadership positions at the National Science Foundation, Marine Biology Laboratory (Woods Hole, Mass.), and Argonne National Laboratory (Ill.). An accomplished visionary, Dean Langford was named inaugural chair of the Minority Affairs Committee of the American Society for Cell Biology, and was appointed to the National Science Board.
