# ...and more

- 50 live on 2 dollars a day.
- 25 live on 1 dollar a day.
- 15 produce more than half the CO2 emissions in the village.
- 17 have no access to medical services.
- 80 live in poor-quality housing.
- 11 have a car; this number is growing, and will probably reach 20 in 20 years.
- 20 have 84% of the paper in use.
- 30 would be without access to a safe water supply
- 40 would lack access to improved sanitation
- 20 would not have any electricity (And of the 8 that do have electricity, most would use it only at night).
- In the village would be 42 radios, 24 televisions, 14 telephones, and 7 computers (some villagers own more than one of each).
- 7 people would own an automobile (some of them more than one).
- 5 people would possess 32% of the entire village's wealth, and these would all be from the USA.
- The poorest one-third of the people would receive only 3% of the income of the village.

### And the population of the village will be 133 people in 2025.
