



2nd Rucio Community Workshop

Call For Hosting

Rucio is an open-source project that provides services and libraries to allow scientific collaborations to manage their volumes of data spread across heterogeneous facilities at multiple locations. Rucio has been principally developed by the ATLAS Experiment and is now used, improved, and evaluated by many more scientific communities.

In March 2018 the 1st Rucio Community Workshop took place at CERN and was attended by over 80 participants. Communities using Rucio in production presented their dataflows and experiences with the system. Also communities interested in Rucio detailed their plans and requirements in managing their data and discussed them with the community. The Rucio development team gave introductions, tutorials, as well as advanced technical presentations to address the different needs of the community. We also featured two keynotes, from the European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecast and Google Cloud Platform.

The 2nd Rucio Community Workshop will last 2 to 3 days and will take place in February or March 2019. We are now seeking interested institutes to host this workshop. We would ask to receive non-binding Letters of Intent by October 19, 2018 via email at rucio-dev@cern.ch. Please include possible dates for February or March 2019.

Desirable features for hosting the workshop are:

Venue

- Auditorium for 2 to 3 days with a capacity of an estimated 100 people
- Wireless networking capabilities
- Vidyo/Video conferencing capabilities
- Coffee breaks close to the auditorium

Lodging

- Availability of accommodation for the attendees close to the venue

- Lunch possibilities close to the venue
- Workshop dinner
