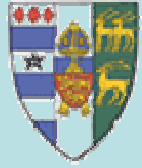

How Much Will it Cost?



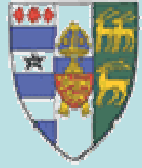

Fees:

- Oxford (and Cambridge) charge the same fees to UK students as the majority of UK Universities
- £3290 per year for UK students starting in 2010
- But – you don't have to pay the fees until you graduate and are earning over £15,000 a year
- Pay back in instalments – if you earn £18000 a year you pay around £5 per week back
- If you never earn over £15000 then you never pay it back

Living Costs:

- Varies depending on personal preference, but you will need to pay for accommodation, food, clothes, books, entertainment etc.
- For 2009-10 academic year we estimate that the average student living in college accommodation will need around £6800 per year for living costs

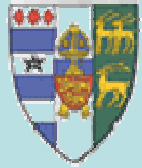

Oxford Opportunity Bursary

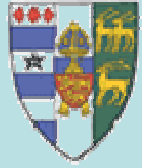
Money given to Undergraduates at Oxford depending on their family income.

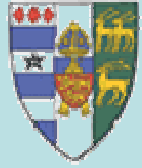

After Oxford

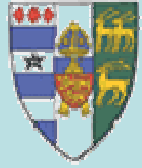

- What do Oxford graduates do?
 - Median salary of Oxford graduates who go on to paid work is 21% higher than for average UK graduate
 - 46% of Oxford students who finished in 2007 had jobs paying more than £25,000.
