



Environmental sustainability -

Reused materials are loaded with all of the context and content that deepen a viewer's perception of the meaning of an art piece.

Time based art-


Materials that show age examine stages of their evolution and de-evolution, highlighting and reflecting on the effect of context on an art piece over time.










