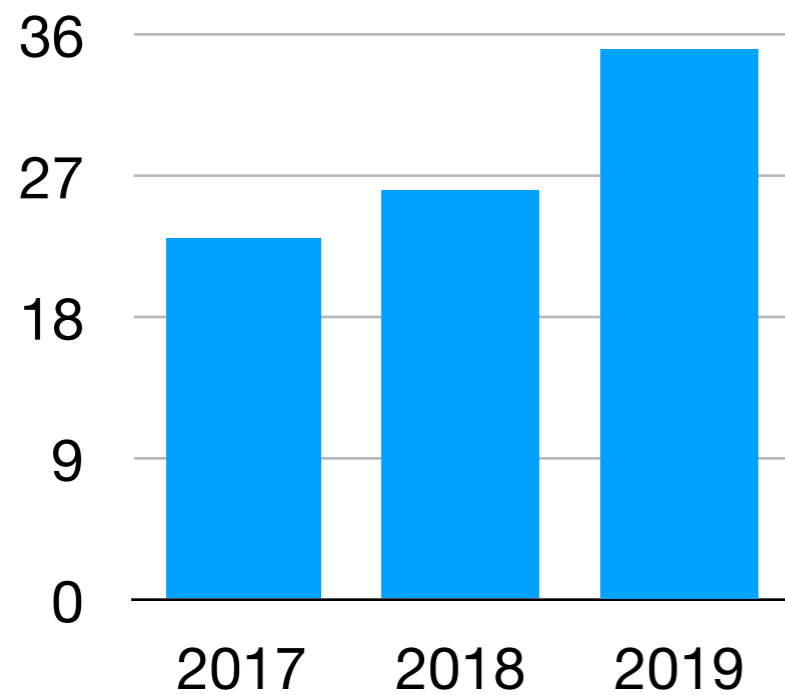
number of talks



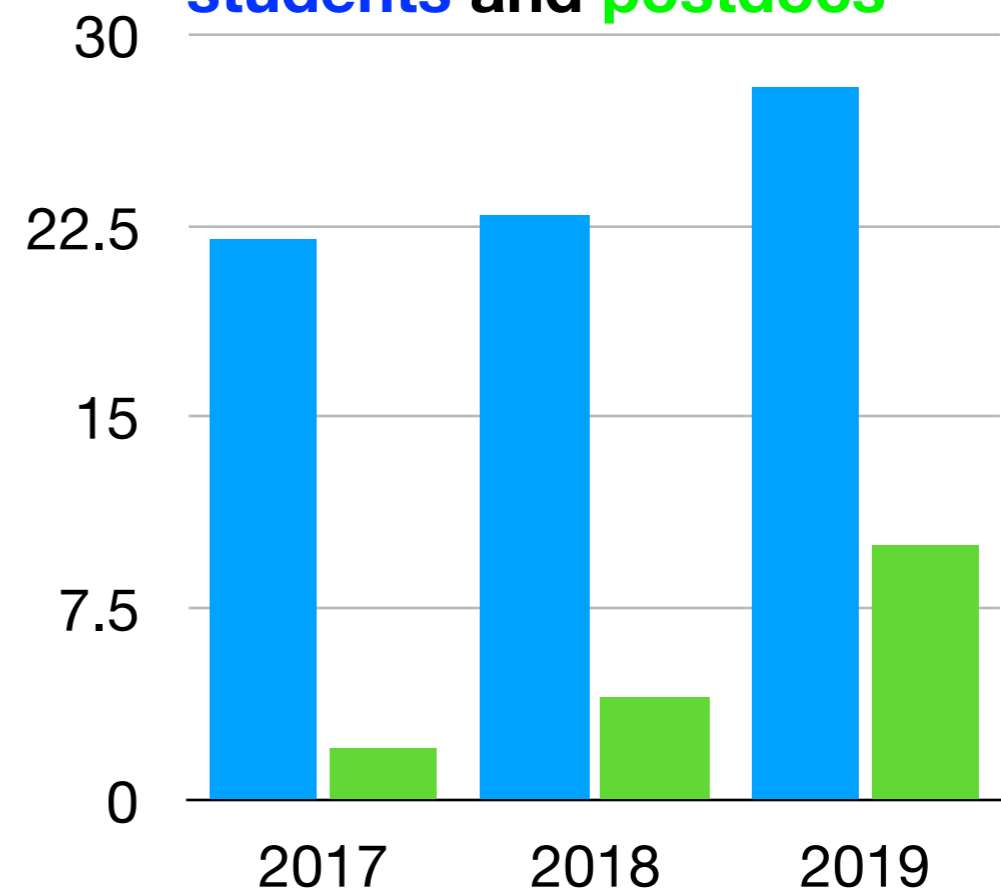
number of all participants
