In the Mexica Calendar this date is represented as:

## ***Tonalpohualli - Sacred Calendar***

**8 Cuauhtli**

**Cuauhtli** - The Eagle. This bird represents the Sun and is related to warriors, rulers.

## ***Xiuhpohualli - Civil Calendar***

**Quecholli**

**Quecholli** - "Bird with flexible neck". Deity: *Mixcóatl*.

## ***Xiuhmolpilli - Bearer of the Year***

**7 Acatl**

**Acatl** - The Cane (reed) is a warrior symbol. The East is the cardinal point for this year, its colour is the red, and its placement is at *Tlapcopa*, "place of light".

## ***Tlatlauhqui Tezcatlipoca - Deity of the Day***

**Tlatlauhqui Tezcatlipoca** (or the *Red Tezcatlipoca*) is the divinity of Eagle Day. The eagle represents the Sun, and the colour red represent it; therefore this deity is entirely painted in red save for the yellow stripes across his face; and one of his hands holds a severed arm that bestows on him great magical powers.

## ***Piltzinteuctli - Underworld Deity***

**Piltzinteuctli** is son of *Oxomuco* and *Cipactónal*, he is the Lord of the princes or the child Lord, protector of the children.

## ***Quetzalcoatl - Diety of the Direction of the World***

**Quetzalcóatl Ehécatl** - "feathered serpent", is one of the most important deities that featured in the creation of the World and its people, giving them the maize plant as their main source of sustenance. He is the god of the wind and the morning, and is identified with Venus. He teaches humans to carve and polish jade and other stones; as well as to weave and craft mosaics with precious bird feathers. He also bestows on them the knowledge of science, astronomy and how to measure time with calendars. He is the ruler of the West and carries upon his body the days of *Calli*,

*Mázatl*, *Ozomatli*, *Cuauhtli* and *Quiáhuatl*.
