Background

- Proposal by James Gillies, Anita Hollier and Emma Sanders in March 2017 to manage CERN's heritage in a more coherent and structured manner through the establishment of a CERN Heritage Committee
- Establishment of CERN Heritage Committee approved by the Enlarged Directorate in April 2017 → delay in implementation due to competing priorities
- CERN History Days on 1 and 2 February 2018 → input from experts
- First meeting of Committee on 10 May 2019

Mandate and scope

- Advisory body reporting to the Director-General
- Overseeing all aspects of the preservation of CERN's heritage and use of the such heritage in education, communications and outreach
 - Identifies resources to be confided to the appropriate repository
 - Provides advice on selection criteria to determine what should be preserved, defines priorities, makes recommendations, and coordinates/oversees activities
 - Identifies and reports on risks to the preservation or communication of CERN's heritage
- No operational budget but can make requests linked to proposed actitivities
- Members appointed for three years (renewable once)

Objectives today

- Establish overview of status in different areas
- Discuss priorities and challenges → basis for action plan
- Organize the future work of the Committee and the interaction among members → need for flexible modalities for engagement and decisionmaking when needed

Next steps

- At least two meetings a year → propose to have next meeting in September, to maintain momentum, and possibly have a third meeting at the end of the year on an exceptional basis (making up for lost time....!)
- Compile prioritized action plan → proposal before Committee in September, with a view to presenting it to the Director-General in October/November and start implementation thereafter (maybe December meeting?)
- Reflect on including CERN Heritage Project in CERN & Society Portfolio based on priorities identified in action plan, to ensure (to the extent possible) funding for implementation
