 - Keep to static versions, dev area for commits (unique non-official html address)

Points Discussed (2)

- Division between (and number of) the guides
 - Some guides seem unnecessary/out-of-date
 - FAQ
 - Introduction to G4
 - Others could be improved
 - Physics lists start by expanding medical physics area
- Licensing
 - It was felt okay to offer doc-source (i.e. rst/sphinx) but with the understanding that they are unofficial and should not be abused
- Publicise better how to contribute to the documentation
 - i.e. the README in gitlab
- Cross search between guides would be very welcome


To publish
