




Status of the Updates

- Following discussions in Bad Honnef end of January, European Strategy Group (ESG) produced 2 documents:
 - (Draft) Update of the European Strategy for Particle Physics: 5-page document with recommendations and short introductory remarks
 - and details

• (Draft) Deliberation document: 20-page documents with more explanations




CERN Council March Meeting

- Council had a first round of discussions on 20 March:
 - cancelled instead
- formal approval likely at June Council session
 - There is still some discussion on what approval actually implies


special Council session on 25 May in Budapest for ESPP formal approval

on 25 May, Council will meet remotely for a second round of discussions



Status of Physics Beyond Collider Study independent of EPPSU

- There are a number of proposals that have been considered in the PBC study with considerable physics potential and modest financial impact
 - These project have been evaluated by the SPSC at CERN
 - In several cases the Research Board has approved a year 2021 programme: COMPASS, NA61, NA62...
 - The technical groups have considered a consolidation programme of the North Area (a first step; could later be followed by an upgrade to the BDF, technically. No approval at this time).





Final Comments

- EPPSU will most likely go public in June 2020
- There is a lot of support for the Physics Beyond Collider activities as an important ingredient of Physics Diversity at CERN (in addition to AD, $ISOLDE, \ldots)$
 - However, we must be wary of the special circumstances that arose recently with implications, which we cannot yet fully appreciate
