This is a reminder that the next RD51 collaboration meeting will be held at Santiago de Compostela from the 5<sup>th</sup> to the 9<sup>th</sup> of October, 2020. The meeting will be largely virtual and fee-free, although registration is enforced. Without detriment to that, on-site attendance will be possible, at the Aula Magna of the Faculty of Physics. As of today, on-site attendance seems likely to be only realistic, if at all, within Iberian Peninsula, however the situation evolves strongly day-by-day. Following the tradition of non-CERN-based RD51 collaboration meetings, a satellite topical workshop is being organized (*New Horizons in Time Projection Chambers*), so that scientific activities will extend for an entire week, from Monday morning (5<sup>th</sup>) up to Friday evening (9<sup>th</sup>). There are 34 confirmed speakers, with a comprehensive program structured along five main topics (fundamentals, operation and performance, types and applications, readouts, and systems). The workshop will extend from the early afternoon up to early evening (CET), and the RD51CM will take place in parallel during mornings. During the event, talks will be recorded, and a slack channel will be set up, to facilitate online discussions and create a more lively workshop-type environment.
